Setting Conservation Priorities and Assessing Risk of Extinction

Risk of global or regional extinction is a necessary but insufficient step in setting conservation priorities for species and sites. This paper will present a synopsis of a recently completed comparative analysis of three of the world's leading systems for assessing extinction risk. In the context of extinction risk assessments for 6,500 Canadian species, I will also discuss the adequacy and use of extinction risk assessments and other information in developing lists of priority species and conservation areas.
