INTRODUCTION - Historical Access

The purpose of identifying historical access sites used in the harvest and management of fish and wildlife resources is to aid in land management decisions made within the Southwest Region. The sites illustrated in this document represent points of access that the department is particularly concerned about obtaining or retaining for public use. These criteria allowed an initial compilation of data on sites, presented here as a working document. However, additional data will be needed before this catalog could be considered a comprehensive list. For example, local use of fish and wildlife resources undoubtedly involves many access points not presently identified in this document. The use of the terms historical access distinguishes these documented sites from those that are legally reserved sites or routes of public access, such as designated easements or section line rights-of-way.

For the most current status of any specific access site, the Alaska Department of Natural Resources files or the files of the Bureau of Land Management should be consulted. A set of 1:1,000,000-scale maps accompanies this volume and can be used as an index to the more detailed 1:250,000-scale reference maps.




Figure 1. Index Map for Catalog of Historical Access - Southwest Region.

This document has been organized so that the public access sites are grouped into three categories: fishery enhancement sites, research and management sites, and recreational access sites. Within each category, the sites are organized by USGS quadrangle, from southeast to northwest, in the numerical order found on the adjoining map (Figure 1). In addition, for each category of site there is a table that lists the sites in the order presented and gives some additional information on each site. This includes a number that corresponds to the site's location on the 1:250,000-scale reference maps. Copies of these reference maps are filed in the ADF&G regional offices.

It should be noted that the entire coastal shoreline and road system are considered historical access points and have not been specifically identified in the text or maps. When one access site extends across more than one 1:250,000 USGS quad, the quad on which the majority of the site is located is the one on which it will be identified.

At the top of each page in this volume is the name of the 1:250,000 USGS quad on which the site is found, the initial for the type of site (M = fisheries management, G = game management, F = fisheries enhancement and R = recreational use), its location number on the 1:250,000 reference maps, and the name of the site in parentheses.

Example CHIGNIK M-(Castle Bay)

The table preceding each quad group within the three different sections lists the site name, its identification number (e.g., M-1), and the contact person within the Department of Fish and Game should more information be required.

Users of this catalog are encouraged to contact the Division of Habitat, ADF&G, with comments and additional data regarding access sites in this region.

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NAKNEK M-1 (Egegik Cabin Site)


General Location: The site is located along the southern portion of Egegik River and approximately 2½ miles below the outlet of Becharof Lake.
