## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Total Points 13

Ruby Creek Roadhouse #2 is the second site of three Ruby Creek roadhouse sites along this stretch of trail. The roadhouse was relocated in approximately 1912 in an attempt to be at a more profitable location at a day's run out of Discovery/Flat. It operated at #2 until approximately 1920 when it was once again relocated to site #3.

Structural remains of two buildings are present at the site. (The structures were reported to have been burnt in the 1950s.)

NOTE: Mileages to Flat, Iditarod, Ophir were branded into sill log below threshold (pers. comm. Alvin Agloff).
