## From field notebook:

Moore Creek Halfway Cabin (IDT-031): 1 story log cabin (retains bark) with saddle notching. The wood plank roof has collapsed. Plank door frame (east orientation). 2 side windows. 3 small rusted traps still attached to roof frame. Inside: stovepipe. Outside: At least 2 pits (cache) close by cabin; some crockery (i.e. 2 bowls) several rusted barrel drums (fuel?). Approximately 40/50 yards east of the cabin is the remains of another cabin (?) - 1 log course, covered with plant growth, outlines a same square cabin shape.

Bonanza Creek Alaska Road Commission Relief Cabin (IDT-030): 1 story, wood plank cabin. Foundation: built with consideration of uneven ground the east section of cabin set on large whole logs laid on ground/grade running north/south; the west half foundation plank wood on ground with the outer floorboard attached with nails. Plank roof - with corrugated tin still intact on the south side; on the north side - asphalt looking paper is mostly peeled off. Gable roof with east/west ridge line orientation. Stove pipe on the NW NU side of roof. Small arctic entry; wood plank; east side pulled away with 6 boards left. Numerous small rusty traps hanging from ceiling of the entryway. Front (only) door is manufactured with frame, same type of wood plank as the rest but entryway protects it from weather still retains redder/brown original color - black glass doorknob. Only window located on the SE side with blocks of wood (1 hinge left) located on both sides of the window where shutters once were attached. Glass is gone with shards lying below window on the ground. Window frame nicely set with bevelled edges.

Interior: Ceiling of canvas draped between 6 wooden beams running north south. Shelves, bunkbed, table evidence of recent use with stove and fire extinguisher. Wood plank floor intact. The NW corner of the cabin is 4 feet (8/10ths of a meter) from the river ( ) bank.

## Measurements:

South side of building without entryway: 4.35 meters

Building width: 3.72 meters

## Cache:

Outlined with log (bark covered) poles - no center pole Measurements: 10.3 meters east of the cabin to the center of the cache (west side); south/north measures 2.65 meters; E/W measures 2.2 meters. Height: 1.45 meters from the gound to the "shelf" level - some planks on the ground
