Dear Ms. Lynch:

This is in response to your letter of October 10, 1978, concerning activities of the Civilian Conservation Corp (CCC) in the Tatina River area and the Kuskokurin Basin in Alaska.

We have searched the pertinent records of the Civilian Conservation Corp in the National Archives but have found no references to CCC activities in the area in which you are interested. It should be noted that the records of the CCC contain relatively little information relating to Alaska. The enclosed copy of a page from a list of CCC camps throughout the United States indicates that there were no centrally organized camps in Alaska in 1935-36 (the period of greatest CCC activities). We did find some mention in the records of various CCC camps in Alaska for a later period, but they were not located in the Tatina River area or in the Kuskokurin Basin.

A copy of your letter has been referred to our Center for Cartographic and Architectural Archives for a separate reply concerning any pertinent maps in its custody.
