STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Shaktoolik Roadhouse is nationally significant because of its association with the Iditarod National Historic Trail. The location of the Shaktoolik Roadhouse, located in 1908, may have been the same as the Foot Hills Roadhouse located to the south of the existing native village sites. The Shaktoolik area and four of its former village locations (identified on the Peterson 1980 maps) are regionally significant. The roadhouse served as a primary stop.
