COMMENTS

In 1900, Rev. Chapman observed 32 natives at this village. Later in 1910, following the intrusion of prospectors into the area in 1907 he observed 24 natives. The village had become a supply post to prospectors. Although the village was inhabited by natives prior to the turn of the century, it seems on the basis of my information, they later relocated at Holikachuk and Shageluk. Archeological and historical information could yield significant data on this little-documented and now extinct Athapaskan band and their culture.
