: These are items which I jotted down while indexing the tapes which might be of interest.

Fr: Carlo Fisher (or Fischer?) RH in Ruby. The original RH, run by Ed Fisher. Building, now altered to one story, still stands. Owned by Johnny May. Charlie indicates that Ed Fishers daughter still lives in Ruby.

- ~~Wild Goose~~ RH last proprietor: Walker
- ~~Sulagna Crossing~~ R.H.: Albert Uoharnik (?)
- You might want to check the tape for location of Ruby → Poorman RH's.

Fr: Gulark - Jean Samansky daughter of Johnny Beaton still living in Anchorage (Pioneer Home?). She has a son out at Golden Creek.

- Kelley Fite - did a site plan of Knik, her work at MAT-SU CC.
- John Cooper Wasilla/Knik Hist Society historian - has done oral history of MAT-SU area.

These notes together with my blue-lines should take care of the oral history information. You might also skim the indexes for further details if you have a question on something. [Indexes are in the oral history file which I have left on Terry's desk.]

In case things get really crazy and you have very little time, here are the major facts from my tapes which you may not have:

Cheokuk - John Bahntke's father ran a R.H. here, in existence prior to 1907. Also a shelter cabin there. After John's father left, R.H. used as a shelter cabin. See index

Cheruk (R.H.?) John Bahntke says old "Farmer Brown" lived near Spruce Cr., between Taylor Lagoon & Toptok. May have been a R.H.

See indexes for other cabin/RH possibilities at Hastings Cr, Lee Cr, etc. Bahntke index is one you should look at.
