In 1895 gold claims were first filed in the Turnagain Arms District and by 1896 this was in the vicinity of the first major gold rush on the Kenai Peninsula. Both Hope City and Sunrise came into being. Hope became the largest and had the most sustained growth for the next 15 years. By time of Alaska earthquake was a semi-ghost camp, mining having diminished by the quake, but still includes a good segment of old buildings.

5. SIGNIFICANCE Commermorates the site of the first (and only) significant gold rush on the Kenai Peninsula.

6. DANGER OF DESTRICTION
Reasonable stablized but fire threat persists.
