STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Port Safety Roadhouse is nationally significant because it is associated with the Iditarod National Historic Trail. The Port Safety Roadhouse was part of the first wireless communication system in the United States, instituted in 1901 and served first as a wireless telegraph station. In later years, the structure served as a roadhouse and a saloon. Some question exists as to whether the existing structure, which still serves as a bar, is the original structure.
