STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Nome has significance because it is in association with the Iditarod National Historic Trail, and the gold mining activities on the Seward Peninsula. Historically, Nome is important because it was the largest population center on the Iditarod Trail, with a population of 12,000 people during the 1900 census. Nome served as a major commercial, transportation, and exploration center for gold mining activities prior to and during the Iditarod gold rush.

Note: During the winter of 1980-81 the city of Nome will be undertaking a city-wide historic survey to determine and locate significant sites and structures within the city of Nome. That information, when available, will be incorporated into the final report.
