COMMITTEE REPORTS

Hiking: Dona Agosti 243-0039
Thirty eight persons have signed up for the Gates of the Arctic trip
July 23 to August 2-3. Reservations are now closed for the Gates of the
Arctic trip in July. Three groups have been formed and will depart on
different dates. If your name is on the list, you will be notified by
mail as to which group you are in. Other instructions are included in
that letter. Remember that you must be a member of MCA. We urge those
who have signed, but already know they do not expect to go, to notify
Dona immediately so the eight on the waiting list may be able to make
plans. Reference materials for this trip include Bob Marshall's "Alaska
Wilderness" (formerly Arctic Wilderness); Two in the Far North, by
Margaret Murie: Alaska Geographic The Brooks Range-Environmental
Watershed, Volume 4, No. 2, 1977: and Arctic Village by Bob Marshall.
MCA Library does not have any of these books, but the Spenard Library
does. Jther branches will order it for you. There are numerous articles
in Alaska Magazine, as well. Check the subject index for Alaska Magazine.

For those who are also interested in the Brooks Range, Ludwig Ferche will lead a hike in the Arrigetch Peaks area from August 13 to 27. Ludwig is out of town until February, but may be reached then at 344-9881. If you had planned to participate in the Gates of the Arctic hike but were too late, this is an excellent alternative. Ludwig will foolow the general route of the last MCA trip, i.e., via Takahula Lake, Takahula River, then over several drainages into the Three Lakes area near the Arrigetch Valley. (Most climbers land at Circle Lake, and hike up Arrigetch Creek, so this will be more hiking and more sightseeing.)

The Memorial Weekend hike will be different this year. Rather than hike the Chickaloon-Knik-Nelchina trail to Boulder Creek, we will start at King River, hike up Young Creek, thence to Sheep Valley and back via another route. We are quite certain there will still be snow in the upper regions, and the leader promises that this will not be a cut and dried trip. Therefore, if you are a trail hiker who likes no surprises, don't sign up for this one.

The 1983 summer hiking schedule is being prepared; anyone who has ideas for a hike, or wishes to lead one, please call Dona at 248-0089.

NALA Support-Once again, please send in letters to the legislature regarding the North Anchorage Land Agreement. The NALA provides that 27,000 acres of native selected land within Chugach State Park (including land around Eklutna Lake) are returned for public use and management. If and when any land on the Ft. Richardson and Elmendorf bases is considered excess to the U.S. Government needs, the Eklutna Inc. land in Chugach State Park will be exchanged for military land.


