
HOLY ASSUMPTION RUSSIAN ORTHODOX CHURCH



The Holy Assumption Russian Orthodox Church was built in 1895-96 according to a common rurol Russian design. In 1900, the bell tower and the fence around the church were both completed. Since then, minor changes have been made to the exterior, including a series of modifications to the bell tower windows. Aside from these alterations, this classic, Russian-style village church looks much the same today as it did in 1905.


Materials Notes:

FEET

Floor: Carpeted wood-plank flooring on hewnlog and concrete foundation.

Walls: 6" hewn log construction throughout, except for beifry, which is of standard, dimensional framing lumber. Exterior is clad in 6" longue and groove siding.

Roof: 6" hand hewn rafters, wood shingles.
