## A RESOLUTION BY THE BETHEL CITY COUNCIL REQUSTING SPECIAL CONSIDERATION OF MERCURY MANAGEMENT FOR MINING OPERATIONS ALONG THE KUSKOKWIM RIVER WATERSHED

- WHEREAS, large scale mining will encourage economic development, job creation, and prosperity in Bethel and the Kuskokwim Region;
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Bethel supports safe and environmentally responsible economic development, including mining:
- WHEREAS, the type of geology found in the area of the Kuskokwim contains high concentrations of mercury and has been referred to as the "mercury belt";
- WHEREAS, the people of the Kuskokwim have traditionally enjoyed subsistence lifestyles which include consuming pike, burbot, and predatory fish;
- WHEREAS, there is currently a fish consumption advisory in effect along the middle Kuskokwim River because of the methyl-mercury content of some species;
- WHEREAS, air, water and fish tissue monitoring before, during and after the operational life of a large scale mine would provide timely mercury exposure data and allow for immediate correction and mitigation should mercury contamination problems arise.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED The City of Bethel supports and promotes responsible and safe development of large scale mining on the Kuskokwim.
