The Donlin Gold project is located in the YKHC service area, approximately 134 air miles from Bethel, near the community of Crooked Creek.

The social and economic benefits of this project to the region will emerge with employment opportunities and increase Native incentive to obtain further education that lead to income cumulatively year round. I believe it is most appropriate, at this stage, to support the Donlin project because it will assist families across Alaska struggling to make ends meet while facing the loss of their jobs, their home and their savings. Economists tell us that the recession is officially over, but it doesn't feel like it for the hundreds of rural Alaskans looking for work.

YKHC, as a Native Corporation, successful from investments made at both regional and local levels, has created major changes, which have resulted in growth in the state and local public services. These changes overall have had a positive impact in the YKHC mission "Working Together to Achieve Excellent Health".
