The seven existing large producing mines in Alaska are operating to the highest standards and in harmony with our renewable resources. This is in part due to the EIS process that gives Alaskans and other stakeholders adequate time to fully review and project documents and provide input on the plans, the State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources enforcing stringent regulations overseeing mining activities statewide that effectively protect the environment, wildlife, and human health, and the rigorous review by the National Environmental Policy Act. The Donlin Gold Project's description demonstrates they to have an understanding of environmental concerns, and features vigorous environmental management principles.

The Donlin Gold project could produce gold for 27.5 years, providing well-paying jobs in a region where few opportunities exist.
