

RESOLUTION 13-02

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE SUBMISSION OF SCOPING COMMENTS TO THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROPOSED DONLIN GOLD PROJECT, WHICH WOULD BE AN OPEN PIT, HARDROCK GOLD MINE TO BE LOCATED APPROXIMATELY 15 MILES NORTHEAST OF GEORGETOWN, AK.

WHEREAS: The Georgetown Tribal Council is a federally recognized Tribal governing

body for the Native Village of Georgetown; and

WHEREAS: Our Tribe works closely with Federal agencies, Tribes and Regional

Native organizations in the Kuskokwim River region in an effort to protect

our environment and human health; and

WHEREAS: New economic developments such as the Donlin Gold proposed gold mine

are entering into the region and the NEPA process allows for public commenting prior to the issuance of the draft Environmental Impact

Statement (EIS); and

WHEREAS: The members of the Native Village of Georgetown wish to ensure the

continued health of the Kuskokwim River and responsible development in

order to protect its subsistence resources and the environment of the

Kuskokwim River watershed; and

WHEREAS: Georgetown Tribal Council deems it appropriate that our comments be

addressed in the Draft EIS, which will aid in protecting Georgetown's Tribal members and their environment for current and future generations.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Georgetown Tribal Council hereby approves and supports these scoping comments for the proposed Donlin Gold project, for which a Notice of Intent was issued on December 14, 2012.
