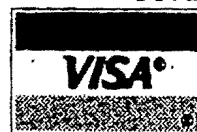

GENERAL INFORMATION: The incumbent serves as administrative director of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council encompassing six members, one each representing the Alaska Department of Law, Fish and Game, and Environmental Conservation, Secretaries of Agriculture, and Interior, and the Administrator for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. For administrative purposes, the position will report to the Council member of the agency from which the person is located or, if an individual is selected from a Federal agency not a member of this council, will report to the USDA member of the council. If the selected individual is not currently with the Federal Government, he or she will report to the USDA member of the Council if selected from this vacancy announcement. This position is also advertised by the State of Alaska through January 15, 1993.

MAJOR DUTIES:

In conjunction with the restoration team, provides vision and leadership, plans, organizes, directs, and coordinates a broad and complex restoration program to improve injured natural resources and related services as a result of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. Directs the development of a general overall plan, budget and accounts for all phases of oil spill activities, and direction to ensure internal and external consistency for the Trustee Council. Develops and implements plans for the spill restoration and injury assessment processes. Develops annual programs of work. Represents the Trustee Council and supports the Restoration Team activities in the resource recovery phase.
