The State of Alaska and the United States (the "governments") jointly apply for disbursement of \$4,743,924.68 from the EXXON VALDEZ Oil Spill Settlement Account. The governments' natural resource trustee agencies will use these funds for purposes consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by this Court in <u>United States v. State of Alaska</u>, No. A91-081 Civ. (D. Alaska) on August 28, 1991 ("MOA").

On August 28, 1991 the State of Alaska and the United

States settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V EXXON VALDEZ arising from the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill. All funds resulting from these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry Investment System ("Registry") administered through the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas. In addition, by order of this Court, an account entitled "EXXON VALDEZ Oil Spill Settlement Account" (the "Account") was established in the Registry specifically for the Exxon settlement proceeds. The Court further ordered that disbursements from the Registry of this Court be made upon joint application of counsel for the United States and the State of Alaska, consistent with the provisions of the MOA.

The governments now seek a disbursement from the Account to fund natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities, data analysis and report preparation for 1993 field work, and administration fees.¹

¹ On June 18, 1992, after the governments filed their first application, this Court issued an order releasing funds from the Account for expenditures incurred during the period from March 1, 1992 through September 30, 1992. The Court issued an additional disbursement order on January 22, 1993 funding restoration work through February 28, 1993, and issued a case status order clarifying its ministerial function with respect to the Account on January 26, 1993.

On June 25, 1993, this Court issued its third disbursement order releasing funds for expenditures through September 30, 1993, including \$7.5 million towards the purchase of certain lands within Kachemak Bay State Park. The State of Alaska effectuated the purchase of those lands on August 27, 1993, when

(A complete summary of the Council's activities since approval of the settlement was appended to our Second Application, filed January 19, 1993, as Attachment B, and an interim update of activities was Attachment B to the governments' Third Application.) Attachment C contains proposed instructions for payment of the monies sought in this application.

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

Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-082 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and <u>State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-083 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, for necessary natural resource damage assessment and restoration activities from October 1, 1993 to January 31, 1994, data analysis and report preparation for 1993 field work from October 1, 1993 to September 30, 1994, and administration from October 1, 1993 to December 31, 1993. The total approved budget, appended hereto, is \$8,521,700.00.

In accordance with the Financial Operating Procedures adopted by the Trustee Council, the amount of funds requested from the Joint Trust Fund is to be reduced by the amount of interest previously earned from settlement funds held by the Federal and State governments and any unobligated fund balances from previously approved budgets. Since the last disbursement from the Joint Trust Fund, the amount of interest earned is \$51,231.00 for the United States and \$64,944.32 for the State of Alaska. Accordingly, the amount to be withdrawn from the fund will be reduced by \$116,175.32 because of interest earned. The unobligated balance for the fiscal period from March 1, 1992 to February 28, 1993, is \$3,661,600.00 for the State of Alaska. The unobligated balance for that time period for the United States will be determined at a later date and subtracted from a subsequent court request. The amount to be withdrawn from the fund will be reduced by \$3,661,600.00 because of the unobligated balance.

By unanimous consent, we hereby request the Attorney General of the State of Alaska and the Assistant Attorney General of the Environmental and Natural Resources

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Division of the United States Department of Justice to petition the United States District Court for the District of Alaska for withdrawal of the sum of \$4,743,924.68 from the Court Registry account established as a result of the governments' settlement with the Exxon companies. Of this amount \$2,516,069.00 shall go to the United States of America and \$2,227,855.68 shall go to the State of Alaska.

ATTACHMENT B

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On January 19, 1993, the United States and the State of Alaska filed their Joint Application for Second Disbursement from Settlement Account, which contained a detailed summary of the Trustee Council's post-settlement activities. In their Joint Application for Third Disbursement from Settlement Account, filed June 21, 1993, the governments updated that detailed summary with a review of the Council's activities through June 1993. The governments most recently updated the Council's activities in their Joint Application for Fourth Disbursement from Settlement Account, filed November 10, 1993.

The Trustee Council had one meeting since the governments filed their last Application, on November 30, 1993. At that meeting, the Council completed its analysis of large habitat parcels available for acquisition, and initiated negotiations to acquire as many as seventeen high-value parcels totaling more than 240,000 acres as part of a comprehensive restoration program. The Council also adopted a draft restoration plan for public comment and a new management structure developed by the Executive Director. The Council reviewed a draft of the 1994 work plan, which includes additional damage assessments and a comprehensive research and monitoring program, and approved circulation of the draft work plan for public comment.

In addition, the Council gave final approval for the expenditure of \$1.5 million for the Archaeological Repository in Kodiak. This project had already been approved subject to National Environmental Policy Act compliance and other conditions designed to improve the project. Those conditions have been met.

Finally, the Council requested that the Departments of Law and Justice petition this court for disbursement of the funds, as reflected in the Resolution attached as Attachment A.

JOINT APPLICATION FOR THIRD DISBURSEMENT FROM SETTLEMENT ACCOUNT

The State of Alaska and the United States (the "governments") jointly apply for disbursement of \$21,067,739.83 from the EXXON VALDEZ Oil Spill Settlement Account. The governments' natural resource trustee agencies will use these funds for purposes consistent with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered by this Court in United States v. State of Alaska, No. A91-081 Civ. (D. Alaska) on August 28, 1991 ("MOA"), over the seven-month period from March 1, 1993 through September

JOINT APPLICATION FOR THIRD DISBURSEMENT FROM SETTLEMENT ACCOUNT - 1 30, 1993.

On August 28, 1991 the State of Alaska and the United States settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V EXXON VALDEZ arising from the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill. All funds resulting from these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be placed in an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry Investment System ("Registry") administered through the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas. In addition, by order of this Court, an account entitled "EXXON VALDEZ Oil Spill Settlement Account" (the "Account") was established in the Registry specifically for the Exxon settlement proceeds. The Court further ordered that disbursements from the Registry of this Court be made upon joint application of counsel for the United States and the State of Alaska, consistent with the provisions of the MOA.

The governments now seek a disbursement from the Account to fund programs described in the 1993 Work Plan.¹ Specifically, the Trustee Council has unanimously agreed to authorize the expenditure of \$7.5 million towards the purchase of certain lands within Kachemak Bay State Park. In addition, it has unanimously

¹ On June 18, 1992, after the governments filed their first application, this Court issued an order releasing funds from the Account for expenditures incurred during the period from March 1, 1992 through September 30, 1992. The Court issued an additional disbursement order on January 22, 1993 funding restoration work through February 28, 1993, and issued a case status order clarifying its ministerial function with respect to the Account on January 26, 1993.

agreed to authorize other expenditures for various restoration programs. Prompt disbursement of these settlement funds will enable the governments to pursue the land purchases at the appropriate times and will enable the restoration projects and ongoing damage assessment studies to continue.

Appended to this application as Attachment A is the Trustee Council's resolution certifying its unanimous agreement to expend these funds, as well as a list specifying the amounts sought for disbursement to each of the trustee agencies and the proposed use for those monies.²

We, the undersigned, duly authorized members of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council do hereby certify that, in accordance with the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered as settlement of <u>United States of America v. State of Alaska</u>, No. A91-081 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and after public meetings and the opportunity for, and consideration of, any written comments from the public, unanimous agreement has been reached to expend funds received in settlement of <u>United States of America v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-082 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and <u>State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-083 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, for necessary natural resource damage assessment, restoration activities and administration for the 1993 Work Plan from March 1, 1993 to September 30, 1993. The total approved budget, appended hereto, is \$21,106,400.00.

In accordance with the Financial Operating Procedures adopted by the Trustee Council, the amount of funds requested from the Joint Trust Fund is to be reduced by the amount of interest previously earned from settlement funds held by the Federal and State governments and any unobligated fund balances from previously approved budgets. Since the last disbursement from the Joint Trust Fund, the United States and the State of Alaska earned interest in the amounts of \$3,648.00 and \$35,012.17, respectively. Accordingly, the amount to be withdrawn from the fund should be reduced by \$38,660.17. Due to the closing of the previous fiscal period on February 28, 1993, precise balances for any unobligated funds are not presently available to the Council. All such unobligated balances will be used to reduce the amount of subsequent withdrawals from the Joint Trust Fund.

On January 19, 1993, the United States and the State of Alaska filed their Joint Application for Second Disbursement from Settlement Account, which contained a detailed summary of the Trustee Council's post-settlement activites. Since that time, the Trustee Council has convened in Anchorage for six meetings: January 19 and 20, 1993, February 16, 1993, March 10, 1993, March 29, 1993, and June 1 and 2, 1993.

At the January meeting, the Council unanimously agreed to expend \$7.5 million towards the purchase of certain lands within Kachemak Bay State Park, and unanimously agreed to fund various other habitat acquisition and restoration projects. At the February meeting, the Council undertook a significant phase of the habitat acquisition process by agreeing to send a letter to landowners in areas affected by the oil spill inviting those landowners to open acquisition discussions. In addition, the Council approved several more restoration projects and continued its work on the 1993 Work Plan. On March 10, 1993 the Trustee Council approved additional 1993 work plan projects including funding construction of the Kodiak Archaeological Museum, a project receiving strong public and Public Advisory Group support. The Trustee Council also authorized staff to begin habitat acquisition negotiations for a number of parcels with high restoration potential. At the March 29, 1993 meeting, the Trustees continued their review and analysis of proposed restoration projects.

Beginning on April 6, 1993, the Trustee Council distributed 28,000 copies of a ten-page summary of the Draft Restoration Plan. It then held public meetings on the Plan in twenty-two communities named below between April 12 and May 5, 1993:

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Anchorage Akhiok Chenega Bay Chignik Lagoon Chignik Lake Cordova Fairbanks Homer Juneau Karluk Kodiak Kodiak Larsen Bay Nanwalek Old Harbor Ouzinkie Port Graham Port Lions Seldovia Seward Tatitlek Valdez Whittier

At its May meeting, the Trustee Council negotiated an agreement to acquire approximately 42,000 acres of habitat at Seal Bay and Tonki Cape on Afognak Island. At its more recent meeting, the Trustees reviewed draft restoration plan options and reviewed the 1994 work plan. The Trustee Council also increased the funding for the salmon coded wire tag recovery programs for 1993.

On August 28, 1991 the State of Alaska and the United 2 States settled their claims against the Exxon Corporation, Exxon 3 Shipping Company, Exxon Pipeline Company, and the T/V EXXON VALDEZ 4 arising from the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill. All funds resulting from 5 these settlements were subsequently ordered by this Court to be : 6 placed an interest-bearing account in the Court Registry in 7 Investment System ("Registry") administered through the United 8 States District Court for the Southern District of Texas. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-082 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, and <u>State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation, et al.</u>, No. A91-083 Civil, U.S. District Court for the District of Alaska, for necessary natural resource damage assessment, restoration activities and administration for the 1993 Work Plan from March 1, 1993 to September 30, 1993. The total approved budget, appended hereto, is \$21,106,400.00.

The moneys are to be distributed according to the following schedule:

In accordance with the Financial Operating Procedures adopted by the Trustee Council, the amount of funds requested from the Joint Trust Fund is to be reduced by the amount of interest previously earned from settlement funds held by the Federal and State governments and any unobligated fund balances from previously approved budgets. Since the last disbursement from the Joint Trust Fund, the United States and the State of Alaska earned interest in the amounts of \$3,648.00 and \$35,012.17, respectively. Accordingly, the amount to be withdrawn from the fund should be reduced by \$38,660.17. Due to the closing of the previous fiscal period on February 28, 1993, precise balances for any unobligated funds are not presently available to the Council. All such unobligated balances will be used to reduce the amount of subsequent withdrawals from the Joint Trust Fund.

By unanimous consent, we hereby request the Attorney General of the State of Alaska and the Assistant Attorney General of the Environmental and Natural Resources Division of the United States Department of Justice to petition the United States District

In addition, the 19 Council approved several more restoration projects and continued 20 its work on the 1993 Work Plan.
