2. Koniag Master Agreement and related Easements

The federal and state lawyers have reviewed Koniag's letter apprising us of its election to terminate the Master Agreement as well as the Conservation Easement and the Camp Island Limited Development Easement. They have prepared a resolution (attached) that address the Council's next steps, namely making the last payment to Koniag and releasing the state and federal interests in the lands covered by the Master Agreement and the above-mentioned easements. The last payment is \$140,684.38 and is due by February 20, 2014.

There is also an administrative issue that arises from this process, *i.e.*, disposition of the funds remaining in the Koniag Sub Account of the Investment Fund (some \$57 million). The federal and state lawyers have determined that these funds are to be used for habitat protection and so should be transferred to the Habitat Sub Account of the Investment Fund. Once that is done, the Koniag Sub Account should be closed. Jen Schorr anticipates

bringing this to your attention at the meeting on the 27th for informational purposes only. The lawyers intend to send me an e-mail directing that I work with the Investment Fund manager to accomplish these tasks once the final payment is made to Koniag.

CHARTER

- OFFICIAL DESIGNATION: Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Public Advisory Committee (Committee).
- 2. AUTHORITY: The Committee is established as mandated by Paragraph V.A.4 of the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered into by the United States of America, through the Department of Justice, and the State of Alaska, through the Attorney General, on August 27, 1991 and approved by the United States District Court for the District of Alaska in settlement of <u>United States of America v. State of Alaska</u>, Civil Action No. A91-081 CV (hereinafter referred to as the MOA) and shall be located in Alaska. Additional authority for its creation is found in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980, as amended, 42 U.S.C. subsection 9601 et seq. This Committee is established in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA), as amended, 5 U.S.C., App. 2.
- 3. OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES: By order of the District Court for the District of Alaska, the Committee is to advise the Trustees (State of Alaska Department of Law, State of Alaska Department of Fish and Game, State of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation, U.S. Department of Agriculture, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce, and the U.S. Department of the Interior) appointed to administer the fund established in settlement of <u>United States v. Exxon Corporation</u>, Civil Action No. A91-082, and <u>State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation</u>, Civil Action No. A91-083, both in the United States District Court for the District of Alaska, in all matters described in Paragraph V.A.1 of the MOA referenced above.
- 4. DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Committee functions are advisory only, and its officers shall have no administrative authority by virtue of their membership. The Committee shall advise the Trustees through the Trustee Council with respect to the following matters:

All decisions relating to injury assessment, restoration activities, or other use of natural resource damage recoveries obtained by the Governments, including all decisions regarding:

- a. Planning, evaluation, and allocation of available funds;
- Planning, evaluation, and conduct of injury assessments and restoration activities;
- Planning, evaluation, and conduct of long-term monitoring and research activities;
- d. Coordination of a, b, and c.
- AGENCY OR OFFICIAL TO WHOM THE COMMITTEE REPORTS: The Committee shall report to the Exxon Valdez Settlement Trustee Council through the Federal members of the Trustee Council.

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- 6. SUPPORT: Support for the Committee shall be provided by the Trustee Council's Executive Director, who shall procure all needed space, supplies, equipment, and support for the Committee. The Executive Director shall prepare an annual budget for the Committee. The budget shall provide for the Committee such funds as the Trustee Council deems appropriate for administrative support for the Committee, from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Investment Fund established as a result of the settlement of United States v. Exxon Corporation and State of Alaska v. Exxon Corporation.
- ESTIMATED ANNUAL OPERATING COSTS: The estimated annual operating cost for the Committee is \$17,00020,000, including all direct and indirect expenses. It is estimated that .2 staff years will be required to support the Committee.
- 8. DESIGNATED FEDERAL OFFICER: The Designated Federal Officer (DFO) is the U.S. Department of the Interior, Alaska Office of Environmental Policy and Compliance's Regional Environmental Assistant, or their designee, who is a full time Federal employee appointed in accordance with agency procedures. The DFO will approve or call all Committee and subcommittees' meetings, prepare and approve all meeting agendas, attend all Committee and subcommittee meetings, adjourn any meeting when the DFO determines adjournment to be in the public interest, and chair meetings when directed to do so by the Trustee Council.
- ESTIMATED NUMBER AND FREQUENCY OF MEETINGS: The Committee is expected to meet approximately once a year.
- DURATION: The requirement for the Committee will continue throughout the life of the settlement agreement referenced in item 2, above.
- 11. TERMINATION DATE: The Committee is subject to the provisions of FACA and is subject to biennial review and will terminate two years from the date the charter is filed, unless, prior to that time, the charter is renewed in accordance with Section 14 of FACA.
- 12. MEMBERSHIP AND DESIGNATION: The Committee shall consist of 10 representative members, including a Chair and Vice-Chair selected by the Committee members. Each member will serve a two-year term and members are eligible for re-nomination and reappointment. One member will be appointed representing each of the interests identified below.
 - aquaculturist/mariculturist (e.g., fish hatcheries and oyster/shellfish farming);
 - commercial fisher (e.g., commercial fishing for salmon, halibut, herring, shellfish and bottom fish; including boat captains and crews, cannery owners/operators, and fish buyers);
 - c. commercial tourism business person (e.g., promoting or providing commercial travel or recreational opportunities, including charter boating, guiding services, visitor associations, boat/kayak rental);
 - d. recreation user (e.g., recreation activities that occur within the area, including kayaking, power boating, sailing, sightseeing)
 - conservationist/environmentalist (e.g., organizations interested in the wise use and protection of natural resources);
 - Native landowner (e.g., regional or village corporations in the affected area established by the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act);
 - g. sport hunter/fisher (e.g., hunting and/or fishing for pleasure);

- h subsistence user (e g, customary and traditional use of wild renewable resources for direct personal or family consumption as food, shelter, fuel, clothing, tools or transportation, for the making and selling of handicraft articles, and for customary trade),
- scientist/technologist (e g , organizations, institutions, and individuals involved in, or with expertise in, scientific and research aspects of the affected area/resources and/or the effects of the oil spill and/or the technical application of scientific information), and
- j public-at-large (e g, representing the affected area of the oil spill and its people, resources, and/or economics)

Members of the Committee serve without compensation However, while away from their homes or regular places of business, members engaged in Committee business approved by the Trustee Council Executive Director or the DFO will be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in the same manner as persons employed intermittently in Government service

- 13 ETHICS RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS: No Committee or subcommittee member shall participate in any specific party matter including a lease, license, permit, contract, claim, agreement, or related litigation with the Department in which the member has a direct financial interest
- SUBCOMMITTEES: The Committee may, upon approval of the Trustee Council and the DFO, establish such workgroups or subcommittees as it deems necessary for the purpose of compiling information or conducting research. However, such work groups or subcommittees may not conduct business and must report to the full Committee.
- RECORDKEEPING: Records of the Committee, and any workgroups or subcommittees established, will be handled as part of the Trustee Council's Official Record, available at their office. A public copy of those records is available at the Alaska Resources Library and Information Services. These records shall be available for public inspection and copying, subject to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U S C 552

Resolution 14-01 Koniag

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RESOLUTION 14-01 OF THE EXXON VALDEZ OIL SPILL TRUSTEE COUNCIL REGARDING TERMINATION OF AND FINAL PAYMENT UNDER THE MASTER AGREEMENT WITH KONIAG INC. AND RECORDATION OF RELEASE OF INTERESTS

WHEREAS in 2001 the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council (Council) resolved to provide funds for the United States and the State of Alaska to enter into a long-term agreement with Koniag, Inc (Koniag) for the protection, through various easement instruments, of approximately 57,000 acres of Koniag-held lands on Kodiak Island within the Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge:

WHEREAS pursuant to a Master Agreement For Protection Of Certain Lands And Resources Between Koniag, Inc., The United States Of America, And The State Of Alaska (Master Agreement) that became effective the following year, \$29,800,000 was set aside in a special account from which yearly payments were to be made to Koniag in October of each year, beginning in 2003, for a Conservation Easement and a Camp Island Limited Development Easement (Easements) covering the aforementioned lands and, potentially, the sale of the fee interest in those lands to the United States;

WHEREAS the initial term of the Easements covered by the Master Agreement was ten years, and Koniag was to notify the United States no later than April 14, 2012 (as to the Camp Island Limited Development Easement) and no later than July 15, 2012 (as to the Conservation Easement) whether it would convey these lands, extend the individual easements (and the yearly payments) for an additional ten-year period, or allow the Easements to expire on October 14, 2012,

WHEREAS the Master Agreement was amended twice in 2012, initially extending the notification date to October 1, 2012 and subsequently to a date thirty calendar days after the Council's first regularly scheduled meeting in 2013 and, at the same time, the parties agreed that that the Master Agreement and the Easements would expire thirty days after receipt of the notice by Koniag of its election to terminate and that the Year 11 payment would be reduced on a pro-rata basis, to be paid no later than ninety days after the required notice;¹

WHEREAS at its first regularly scheduled meeting in 2013, the Council authorized the extension of Koniag's opportunity to elect termination of the Master Agreement and Easements to thirty calendar days after its next regularly scheduled meeting,

WHEREAS the Council's next regularly scheduled meeting was held on October 28, 2013;

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¹ Year 11 of the Easements ran from October 15, 2012 through October 14, 2013.

WHEREAS the Year 11 payment was transferred to Koniag on October 25, 2013;
WHEREAS on November 22, 2013, Koniag provided notice to the Council, the State of
Alaska and the United States of its election to terminate the Master Agreement, including the
Conservation Agreement and the Camp Island Limited Development Easement, and

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 13 of the Master Agreement, Koniag may request that the United States and the State of Alaska execute a Release of Interests or other documentation suitable for recording that acknowledges the termination of the Master Agreement and any easements granted thereunder and the release of any Koniag lands from the terms of those easements;

The Council now finds, after review and consideration of public comment, that

- As a result of the actions outlined above, the Master Agreement terminated on December 22, 2013 and that the appropriate pro-rata payment to be made to Koniag for the 69-day period of Year 12 of the Easements, i e., from October 15, 2013 to December 22, 2013, is \$140,684.38, and
- 2 If requested by Koniag, a release of the federal and state interests in the lands covered by the Easements or other similar documentation, as described in Section 13 of the Master Agreement, would be appropriate.

THEREFORE, by unanimous consent, we request that the Assistant Attorney General of the Environment and Natural Resources Division of the United States Department of Justice and the Alaska Department of Law take such steps as are necessary for the Council to provide \$140,684.38 in joint settlement funds from the Koniag Sub Account of the Investment Fund to Koniag by February 20, 2014, and we further request that the appropriate agencies of the United States and the State of Alaska, upon the request of Koniag, execute and record in the Kodiak Recording District appropriate documentation acknowledging the termination of the Master Agreement, the Conservation Easement and the Camp Island Limited Development Easement and the release from their terms of the Koniag lands that were the subject of those agreements
