Here is what I was able to find out about the Koniag deal. I hope it's what you are looking for and again, I apologize for the run-around.

- \$28.5 million sale price for Koniag, of which \$21.5 million comes from the trust fund, while \$7 million comes from the federal criminal restitution funds.
- Payments are made over four years. The first payment is \$15 million, of which \$13 million goes towards phase 1 land purchase and \$2 million goes for granting a 7 year, non-development easement along the Karluk and Sturgeon Rivers. In addition, agreed to keep available \$16.5 million toward final purchase of Koniag Karluk and Sturgeon Rivers.
- Phase 2 is \$4.5 million to be paid no later than Sept. 30, 1996.
- Phase 3 is also \$4.5 million to be paid no later than Sept. 30, 1997.
- Phase 4 is \$4.5 million to be paid no later than Sept. 30, 1998.

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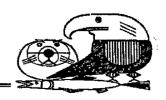

Anchorage to discuss mutual concerns about restoration. A Community Conference Steering Committee, comprised of participants from the conference, was formed to follow up on the issues raised at the conference. The Steering Committee and the local facilitators met during the Trustee Council's 1996 Restoration Workshop and made the following recommendations regarding community involvement:

- Increase communications with the communities on research findings in non-technical language either through the Trustee Council newsletter, the bi-monthly Community Involvement Report (prepared by the Spill Area-Wide Coordinator), a radio program, school presentations, posters, or some other form of communication.
- Create a forum for local traditional knowledge bearers and principal investigators to increase the exchange between culturally diverse groups in an effort to plan, implement and evaluate future restoration projects.
- Develop protocols to assist principal investigators and local communities in regard to contact with the communities and collection of traditional ecological knowledge, including methodology, data ownership, compensation and data coordination.

Other projects funded by the Council that involve communities are described in the Subsistence section (page ##).

Alaska SeaLife Center

In 1995 the Trustee Council contributed \$25 million toward the construction of basic marine research infrastructure at the Alaska SeaLife Center. The Council approved funding for this facility following a determination that no existing facilities in Alaska adequately addressed known and anticipated needs for laboratory-based research for the long-term restoration of marine mammals, marine birds, and fish.

The Alaska SeaLife Center is scheduled to open for research in mid-1998. To plan for the anticipated opening, the Trustee Council is interested in knowing if a proposal for FY 97 entails the use of Alaska SeaLife Center facilities in FY 98 or future years. Proposals that would require preliminary work in FY 97 before fully using the facility in FY 98 will be considered for Trustee Council funding. The instructions for writing FY 97 Detailed Project Descriptions (Appendix A) ask whether a proposal expects to use Alaska SeaLife Center facilities in FY 98 or future years.

In order to ensure that space at the Alaska SeaLife Center is available and appropriate for the research planned, proposals that indicate a need for the Alaska SeaLife Center facilities in FY 98 or future years will be forwarded to the Center's scientific review committee for screening before the Trustee Council makes its funding decisions. To expedite this process, proposers are encouraged to discuss their proposed use of the Center with its scientific director, Dr. Mike Castellini, before submitting a FY 97 proposal to the Trustee Council.

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide you with a copy of preliminary draft budgets for Project Management (Project 97250) and the Restoration Work Force support for trustee agency liaison functions (part of Project 97100). The draft budgets were developed with three basic principals in mind:

- continue the reduction of administrative and management expenditures in parallel with the overall work plan as directed by the Trustee Council;
- provide an equitable level of funding support for each agency in recognition of the relative amount of work associated with the projects that the agency administers (e.g., management of one multi-agency ecosystem project requires far more effort than management of a closeout project); and
- ensure that agencies have adequate funding to support necessary administration of the restoration program.

Using the preliminary draft FY 97 Work Plan recommendations reviewed at the work session on Thursday, May 23rd, please find attached:

1. Draft FY 97 Project Management Budget

A draft of the Project Management budget (Project 97250) is attached along with a summary table. This draft has been prepared using the initial Project Management proposals submitted by individual agencies

together with the draft FY 97 Work Plan recommendations of the Executive Director as reviewed on Thursday. The summary includes the number/cost of the projects each agency is anticipated to manage and a draft recommendation for funding (staff months/funding).

2. <u>Draft Restoration Work Force - Liaison Support Budget</u>

As a starting point, the draft Restoration Work Force - Liaison budgets were prepared using the FY 96 funding levels of approximately \$120,000 per agency (i.e., one FTE plus Trustee Council member travel). In those cases where an agency has relatively few projects, part time liaison funding is reflected in the draft budget.

With the exception of Trustee Council member travel, please let me know if the proposed allocations should be adjusted between line items.

The draft Project Management and Restoration Work Force - Liaison budgets will be discussed at the next Restoration Work Force meeting on Thursday, May 30 starting at 9:00 am. The overall draft FY 97100 - Administration, Public Information, and Science Management budget will also be reviewed at that time. (Due to its large size, a copy of that draft budget will be distributed under separate copy on Tuesday.)

If you wish to meet individually with me or Molly McCammon prior to Thursday, please let me know so that a time can be arranged.

It is expected that the winter counts of birds now underway since the spill on a weekly basis will provide a good estimate of the current population of birds and may provide insight into the effects of the spill. There are also studies planned for examining the contamination of the diet of sea and shore birds. We did observe many birds on contaminated beaches, including gulls and oystercatchers.

A major resurvey of the grey seal pupping areas will be made later this spring or summer.

The MAFF had cruises underway at the time of our visit to examine potential effects of the dispersed oil on the ground fish offshore. Both contamination measurements of fish and measures of potential impact are being made. MAFF will also be putting together a budget of the fate of the oil. Mussels, cockles and sea weed will be monitored at several onshore sites by MAFF.

Public Information

One public information officer with the Coast Guard served as the point of contact for the press at Milford Haven during the initial spill response actions. The media interest centered on the grounding and regrounding of the vessel and the bird casualties. The press stayed on scene at Milford Haven for about 14 days and reduced their coverage after the Sea Empress was removed from the wreck site and taken to the refinery's dock. The public information officer returned to Southampton after the press reduced their coverage.

Preliminary comparison of the Exxon Valdez and Sea Empress Oil Spills

In Table 1 comparative statistics on spills are provided. In addition, my general impressions of differences between the spills are as follows:

- 1. The Irish Sea to the west of the spill and the Bristol Channel to the south, as well as aggressive use of dispersants, resulted in less shoreline impact than in the Exxon Valdez oil spill.
- 2. The spill occurred in late winter, about a month earlier than the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. This also helped to minimize the impact, especially on seabirds which congregate later in the year at breeding colonies along the south Pembrokshire Coast.
- 3. The public and media reaction seemed to be less intense to this spill than occurred in Alaska. Perhaps the lack of a shoreline impact from the recent *Braer* Oil Spill alleviated public concerns about oil spills. Petroleum refining is one of the few obvious industries besides farming in this portion of Wales,

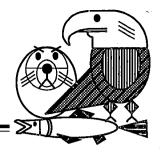

Dear Dave,

The purpose of this letter is to confirm our prior conversation regarding the intent of the Restoration Office to vacate half of the first floor of the Simpson Building effective January 1, 1997 (i.e., the side with the large meeting area). This portion of the first floor accounts for approximately 2,500 square feet (a more precise measure of 2,548 sq. ft. was recently made by Tami Yockey).

Under the terms of the current lease, as extended:

Lessee shall have the unilateral right to reduce space of the first floor in increments of approximately 2500 square feet, after January 1, 1997, by giving the lessor a minimum of six months written notice.

Formal written notice is due to the lessor no later than July 1, 1996.

The space reduction provision was included in the lease extension with anticipation of the Restoration Office "downsizing" as reflected in the memo from David Bruce to Molly McCammon dated March 9, 1995 (copy attached). For budgeting purposes, we plan to be out of that space, at the very latest, by the end of December 1996 (i.e., at the end of the first quarter of FFY 1997). As we discussed, the current lease cost is \$1.1875/sq. ft./month. Accordingly, relinquishment of this space should reduce our lease payments by \$2,969 per month (\$1.1875/sq. ft. X 2,500 sq. ft.).

As we also discussed, the space to be relinquished may be of interest to another state agency. We are currently in the process of vacating the space and plan to have that process completed by the end of September. Thus, if another agency were interested in the space, occupancy could occur on or about October 1, 1996. This would clearly be in our fiscal interest in that another tenant could assume the lease costs between October 1, 1996 and December 31, 1996. Also, if you know of an agency interested in occupying the

space *prior to* October 1, 1996 it *might* be possible to accelerate our current schedule somewhat. If you wish to explore this possibility further, please contact Tami Yockey (278-8012).

In any case, please know that irrespective of whether another state agency is eventually situated in this space, the Restoration Office will vacate by January 1, 1997 and that notice should be provided to the lessor no later than July 1, 1996 (unless you can secure an alternative tenant). As I believe you are aware, our long term plan is to eventually vacate the entire first floor in the expectation that the Oil Spill Public Information Center (OSPIC) will be merged with a larger "coalition library" at another location. While there is an active planning process well underway, the timing of this proposed "coalition library" merger and relocation of OSPIC off-site remains uncertain.

If you have any questions regarding this matter please let me know.

Enclosed is a copy of the extension of lease number 2239 negotiated by the Department of Administration on our behalf. Also included is a copy of the initial lease.

At this time we are under the initial lease, which goes through December 31, 1995. The lease extension covers the period January 1, 1996, through December 31, 2001. This is the maximum allowed by law. The lease extension requires that renovations be made under the existing lease.

The extension allows vacating the first floor in increments of 2500 square feet on or after January 1, 1997, with six months notice. The phrase "approximately 2500 square feet" was used as that is approximately what the library side or the meeting room side would equate to. For example, if you want to give up the meeting room on January 1, 1997, notice would be given on July 1, 1996. Please note that vacating requires only six months notice and is not tied into a small window once a year as with many leases.

One year later (January 1, 1998) reductions on the fourth floor can begin after giving six months notice beginning July 1, 1997. You could totally vacate the building on January 1, 1998, if you so desire. General Services advised that should space needs decrease and there is another State Agency wanting space about that size being given up, you could work out an arrangement acceptable to all parties--that is your option.

There is a non-funding clause included, no one seems to know if it would stand up. Apparently the one used in other documents that refers to appropriations by the Legislature of State funds is only valid if the State goes out of business.

The agenda for a Trustee Council meeting in Kodiak on June 15 is shaping up. The schedule includes leaving Anchorage early Saturday morning and flying over the Afognak Joint Venture and Shuyak Island lands. Depending on the size of the group, some may fly directly using the USFWS Goose, with the rest going commercial to Kodiak, then using the USFWS Beaver to fly over the AJV and Shuyak lands. In any event, the morning would be spent on the fly-over.

The afternoon activities include a noon luncheon with the borough assembly and other local dignitaries, as well Senator Stevens, followed by a 2 pm ground breaking ceremony for the Fisheries Technology Center's new facility, a public reception at the Alutiiq museum from 3 - 5pm, and a Trustee Council public hearing/meeting from 5 - 6:30pm. The Kodiak Chamber of Commerce is also having a big event that evening. There is a 10:30 pm flight back to Anchorage that night.

The Governor and Lieutenant Governor have been invited to these events, but have not yet confirmed their attendance due to uncertainties with the legislature.

As I've mentioned to several of you, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has offered to arrange a float trip of the Karluk River immediately following this meeting. The plan would be to fly to Camp Island on Karluk Lake the evening of June 15, followed by 3 days on the river, allowing 1 extra day for bad weather. USFWS needs to know as soon as possible who will be attending this portion of the trip, so they can make the appropriate arrangements. It is understood that for the state trustees, it may depend somewhat on the status of the special session.

This letter is to follow up your recent discussions with Stan Senner and Bruce Wright in regard to a scientific symposium on the 10th anniversary of the *Exxon Valdez* oil spill. The Trustee Council is interested in working with Sea Grant to hold this event, and I am pleased to know that Sea Grant would make this event a priority in its schedule for 1999.

As a starting point, what we have in mind has two parts: (1) a one-day publicly-oriented overview session, which is followed by (2) a three-day technical symposium. The symposium would be in Anchorage, including the actual anniversary date, March 24 1999. There may be other anniversary events planned in the oil-spill area, but the balance of this letter only concerns this science symposium.

In terms of topics, from the standpoint of the Trustee Council, there are three primary areas of interest: (1) what has been learned about injury and recovery 10 years after the spill, (2) what has been learned about the northern Gulf of Alaska-Prince William Sound ecosystem, and (3) the benefits and management applications of EVOS restoration projects. Although many people, especially in the news media, will be most interested in the first topic, the Trustee Council will also want to emphasize the positive, long-term aspects of the *Exxon Valdez* restoration program.

We envision that the technical symposium would be open to all researchers (i.e., from trustee agencies, Exxon Corporation, and others), although there may be some invited papers to ensure coverage of the key topics. Among these researchers, it may be appropriate to include work on sociological and economic aspects of EVOS, as well as on other oil spills. In regard to publications, there is much to discuss, but the Trustee Council envisions both an abstract book and a technical proceedings.

There are many other issues to discuss, and I recognize the need to begin planning the anniversary science symposium soon and with full Sea Grant participation. To that end, I appreciate your willingness to work with Stan and Bruce to organize a planning meeting this summer and to continue those efforts in FY 1997. The administrative budget for the restoration office can cover the necessary expenses in FY 1996, and we will reserve up to \$7.0 for this purpose in FY 1997. Beyond FY 1997, we will need to jointly plan for full budgets to cover the necessary costs in FY 1998 and 1999 and possibly beyond (e.g., related to a technical proceedings).

Structurally, we envision that there will be a primary organizing committee including yourself on behalf of Sea Grant and 4-5 representatives from the Restoration Work Force (i.e., this office and the trustee agencies). Stan Senner will be your primary contact from the Restoration Office. In addition, it will probably be helpful to identify 2-3 non-agency persons to advise the organizing committee. You have suggested that Mike Castellini could represent UAF and the scientific community. Representatives of Alaskan native, environmental, and fishing interests might be other possibilities.

This letter is intended to serve as a formal expression of interest and commitment by the Trustee Council. Please let me know if you are in agreement with the framework outlined above and if you have additional issues or considerations to express now. Thank you.

This letter provides the joint instructions of the United States and the State of Alaska (the "Governments") regarding the payment of \$70,000,000 due to be made by Exxon Corporation and/or Exxon Shipping Company (collectively "Exxon") on September 1, 1995 under the Agreement and Consent Decree (the "Decree") between the Governments and Exxon in the cases cited above.

We ask that Exxon make this payment in two increments, as follows:

1. Pay \$67,303,400 to the Clerk of the Court by electronic funds transfer to:

as specified in the Amended Orders for Deposit and Transfer of Settlement Proceeds entered by the Court on July 31, 1995.

This payment is for the Governments' costs of planning, administering, and implementing the restoration, replacement, enhancement, or acquisition of the equivalent of natural resources injured by the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill, in accordance with the Decree and the Memorandum of Agreement and Consent Decree entered on August 28, 1991, in <u>United States v. State of Alaska</u>, No. A91-081 CIV (D. Alaska).

One business day prior to this transfer, please advise Ms. Phyllis Rhodes, Clerk, United States District Court for the District of Alaska, by fax (907-271-5564), that the transfer is to be made, so that she can make the necessary arrangements. Please provide Ms. Rhodes with the name and telephone number of the contact at Exxon's bank to whom she can speak in the event there is a problem with this electronic transfer. We would appreciate your making the transfer at the start of the business

day (around 9:00 a.m.) Eastern time. If the transfer cannot be made at that time, please call Ms. Rhodes on the day before the transfer to advise her of that fact and establish the approximate transfer time.

Once the transfer has been made, please send written confirmation of the transfer (including the amount) to each of the addresses listed for the United States and the State in Paragraph 36 of the Decree.

2. Pay \$2,697,000 to the United States Department of Agriculture by check payable to "USDA, Forest Service" and sent by Federal Express or other guaranteed overnight delivery service to:

Please indicate on the check that it is in reimbursement of EXXON VALDEZ costs. If you have any questions about the procedure for this portion of the payment, please contact Peggy Gwynn at (202) 205-1115. This payment is for reimbursement of past natural resource damages assessment costs incurred by the United States. Please send confirmation of this payment to each of the three addresses listed for the United States in Paragraph 36 of the Decree.

While the State of Alaska asserts that it is entitled to additional reimbursements for eligible expenses, in order to ensure that adequate funds are available for potential restoration projects in the coming year, it has agreed to defer those reimbursements until receipt of a future payment from Exxon.

Finally, in accordance with the Clerk's request, please file with the Court in each of the two above-referenced cases a notice stating the exact amounts of money paid, to whom they were paid, and what these monies represent.

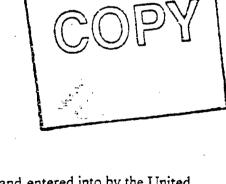

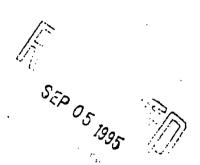

This letter provides the joint instructions of the United States and the State of Alaska (the "Governments") regarding the payment of \$150 million, minus certain costs described below, due to be made by Exxon Corporation and/or Exxon Shipping Company (collectively "Exxon") on December 1, 1992 under the Agreement and Consent Decree (the "Decree") between the Governments and Exxon in the cases cited above.

Paragraph 8(b) of the Decree requires Exxon to pay by December 1, 1992, an amount equal to \$150,000,000 minus Exxon's expenditures for EXXON VALDEZ oil spill cleanup activities in accordance with directions of the Federal On-Scene Coordinator ("FOSC") (1) up to a cap of \$4,000,000 for the period from January 1 through March 12, 1991, and (2) after March 12, 1991, subject to prior approval of costs by the FOSC and to audit by the Governments. Paragraph 11(b) of the Decree also contains a definition of the "Expenditures" which Exxon may be entitled to deduct for the period after March 12, 1991.

The Coast Guard has advised us that the FOSC has approved a total deduction under Paragraph 8(b) of \$39,947,731.46. The

Coast Guard has further advised that, with one exception, there is no dispute about this amount. The exception, I understand, is that the FOSC disallowed a \$225,000 item claimed by Exxon for self-insurance. The Coast Guard's position is that this item does not qualify as an "Expenditure" under the definition in Paragraph 11(b) of the Decree. Thus, based on the deduction approved by the FOSC, the amount due from Exxon on December 1 is \$110,052,268.54.

As you know, Paragraph 8(b) of the Decree provides the Governments the right to audit Exxon's post-March 12, 1991 Expenditures, in addition to the requirement that such Expenditures receive advance approval by the FOSC. Dear John:

This confirms the substance of our telephone conversation on November 25, 1992, and accordingly modifies the November 24, 1992 joint instructions of the United States and the State of Alaska (the "Governments") for the payment due from Exxon Corporation and Exxon Shipping Company ("Exxon") under paragraph 8(b) of the Agreement and Consent Decree (the "Decree") between the Governments and Exxon. Because this modification is minor and favorable to the Governments, after consultation with counsel for the State, I am authorized to confirm it on behalf of the United States and the State.

You advised me on November 25 that Exxon had discovered an erroneous billing which requires a reduction of \$340,043.28 in the oil spill cleanup costs to be deducted from Exxon's December 1, 1992 payment. You indicated that this error resulted from the mistaken inclusion, in the cost documentation that Exxon provided to the Coast Guard, of a photographer's invoice for work that was not part of the oil spill cleanup. As we discussed, eliminating this amount from Exxon's cleanup costs reduces the deduction to which Exxon is entitled under paragraph 8(b) of the Decree to

\$39,913,688.18, and makes the total amount due from Exxon on December 1 \$110,086,311.82.

As I told you on November 25, the additional \$34,043.28 that Exxon will pay on December 1, beyond the amount addressed in the Governments' November 24, 1992 instructions letter, should be added to the amount paid to the Clerk of the Court for the Governments' costs of planning, administering, and implementing the restoration, replacement, enhancement, or acquisition of the equivalent of natural resources injured as a result of the EXXON VALDEZ oil spill. The instructions for that payment are set forth in numbered paragraph 1 on pages 2-3 of the November 24 letter. The amount to be paid in accordance with that paragraph is therefore increased to \$56,586,311.82 (instead of the \$56,552,268.54 figure in the November 24 letter). In all other respects, the instructions set forth in the November 24, 1992 letter from Acting Assistant Attorney General O'Mears and Alaska Attorney General Cole to Edward J. Lynch of Exxon Corporation are unchanged.

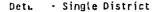

This letter provides the joint instructions of the United States and the State of Alaska (the "Governments") regarding payment of the initial \$90 million, plus accrued interest, due to be paid by Exxon Corporation and/or Exxon Shipping Company (collectively "Exxon") under the Agreement and Consent Decree (the "Decree") between the Governments and Exxon in the cases cited above.

We understand that Exxon deposited the \$90 million into an escrow account on October 3, 1991, as required by Paragraph 9 of the Decree. Under that paragraph, Exxon must pay the escrowed money, plus an amount "calculated by applying to each deposit a rate equal to the average daily yield on three-month Treasury bills while the funds are on deposit" (referred to herein as "accrued interest"), to the Governments upon Final Approval of the Decree and within five business days of receipt of written instructions from the Governments as to how and where the money is to be paid. Final Approval, as defined in the Decree, will occur on December 9, 1991. Assuming that these instructions reach you today, December 9, payment should be made within five business days, i.e., by December 16.

We ask that Exxon make this payment in three increments, each including the accrued interest on the specified portion of the escrowed funds, as follows:

1. Pay \$36.5 million, plus the accrued interest on that amount, to the Clerk of the Court by electronic funds transfer to:

Thank you for soliciting our comments regarding the application from the Prince William Sound Regional Citizens' Advisory Council (RCAC) seeking recertification as the voluntary advisory group for Prince William Sound under OPA 90.

The Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council was established in September 1991 to administer the joint trust funds resulting from the settlement of the State of Alaska's and United States Government's claims against Exxon Corporation following the 1989 oil spill.

Although the missions and functions of the Trustee Council and RCAC are different, our region of operations and overall constituency are the same: Prince William Sound, lower Cook Inlet and the Kodiak-Afognak Island archipelago. We both have public processes that focus on two-way communication and information sharing. We both have boards that represent various segments of the public. In fact, several people sit on both boards.

As I mentioned in my letter last year, there is a great deal of knowledge about and support for RCAC's work within the spill area. RCAC continues to work with local communities and provide a bridge between citizens, industry and government agencies. This can only result in more cooperation and better decision-making on the part of industry and government regulators.

In addition, the Trustee Council and RCAC are sharing information on a regular basis, especially in the realm of scientific research and monitoring in the spill-impacted area. It is important that such research be done cooperatively when possible in order to prevent duplication and provide maximum value for the dollars expended.

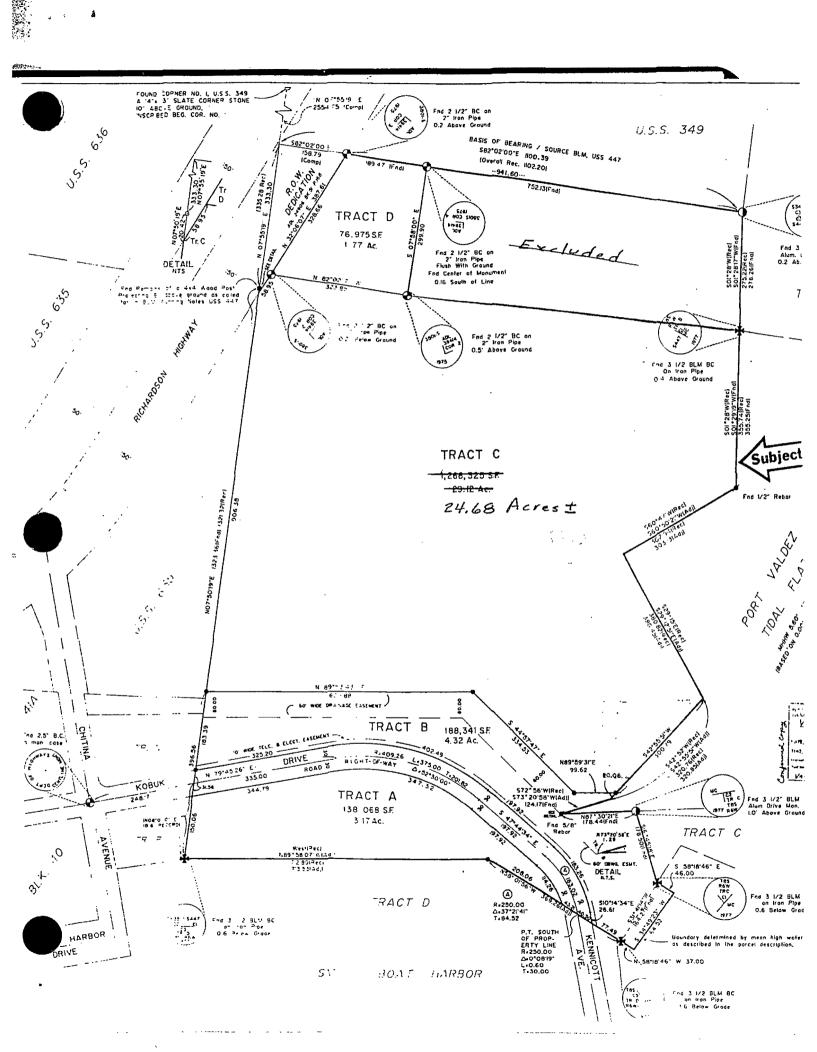

Attached you will find a document containing draft protocols for conducting research using Traditional Ecological Knowledge in or nearby the spill area communities. These protocols were drafted at a two day workshop in April, attended primarily by the community facilitators hired through the Community Involvement Project, some work force members, and Restoration Office staff.

The communities are now reviewing this draft, with their comments due to the Restoration Office by June 14, 1996. I would like you to please review the draft from your individual agency's and your principal investigators' perspective, and get comments back to me no later than June 14. The goal is to have a document that is acceptable to both the communities and to the Trustee Council.

If you have any questions about this or wish to discuss any issues this may generate, please don't hesitate to contact me.

DRAFT FOR REVIEW PROTOCOLS FOR UTILIZING INDIGENOUS AND LOCAL KNOWLEDGE IN THE EVOS RESTORATION PROCESS

Introduction

Indigenous and local knowledge provide an important perspective that can help the restoration effort by providing information and analysis of the environment and resources affected by the oil spill. While the differences between indigenous and scientific ways of knowledge must be understood, successful projects will improve our collective understanding of the natural processes involved in the restoration work.

Working in and with communities requires sensitivity to their cultures, customs, and traditions. Successful working relationships are built on mutual respect and trust. These protocols describe the major elements of a research partnership, but their application depends on using common sense and acting with common courtesy.

Protocols

- EVOS research involving the communities should follow the Guidelines for Research adopted by the Alaska Federation of Natives.
- o Initial contacts should be made through the Community Involvement Spill Area Wide Coordinator (CISAWC, Martha Vlasoff), who will do a preliminary screening to determine the purpose of the visit before passing the requests on to the communities concerned.
- Once contact has been established through the CISAWC, researchers should use the Community Facilitator or designee as the primary community contact.
- The Community Facilitator will make the necessary local arrangements for the researcher to meet with the Village Council to discuss the project's goals, scope, methods, expectations, benefits, and risks. The Facilitator will help orient the researcher to the community and its customs.
- The researcher and the village council, assisted by the facilitator, will work together to set up a research agreement. This agreement will address the nature of the research, permissions and consent that are needed, the need for local research assistants, compensation of participants, acknowledgment, confidentiality, oversight, review, data ownership, and storage and return of results.
- Research projects should provide meaningful training to local assistants to develop skills for community-based research.

DRAFT FOR REVIEW

- Researchers will obtain informed consent from all participants, addressing anonymity, confidentiality, and review of drafts.
- Results of the research will be returned to the community in the form of all publications and reports produced by the project, which will include a plain-language summary, presentation in the community, and in cooperation with the EVOS Restoration Office for other initiatives it undertakes.
- Researchers and community residents should keep in mind how this information will be integrated and utilized in improving restoration, management, education, and future research.
- All research projects involving the communities will be evaluated by the researcher, the community facilitator, and the village council. The overall program of community-involved research will be reviewed during the EVOS Annual Meeting.
- In developing proposals and research plans and budgets, researchers should anticipate the costs of activities called for in these protocols.
- The protocols should also provide guidance for research projects involving local knowledge and involvement outside the Native communities.

During my recent trip to Kodiak, a number of community residents raised questions concerning the status of crab and shrimp resources in the spill area. Would you please work with the appropriate agencies (ADF&G and NOAA) to prepare a memorandum on the status of crab and shrimp populations: whatever knowledge we have on the impacts of the oil spill on them; what kinds of restoration/research/management activities are underway by other entities; and possibilities for future restoration/enhancement activities. Since these resources seem to be of major interest to the spill area communities, please also give me a recommendation on the usefulness of a small workshop on these resources next fall/winter, a session on them at the annual workshop in January, or other means of addressing these concerns.

It would be helpful to have this memorandum by August.

This memorandum was developed to provide you a summary analysis of the 1997 Work Plan and a few highlights. At this time, I have read the Detailed Project Descriptions associated with the continuing projects and reviewed the proposed budgets. I have not yet reviewed the new proposals.

The total requested for Fiscal Year 1997 is \$41,157,900 which is distributed as follows:

16,182,500
584,400
947,500
3,200,000
20,243,500

Funding for the trustee agencies and the non-trustee organizations has been consolidated in this analysis. With the exception of project 97100, the numbers discussed in this memorandum represent line item funding requested by the trustee agencies, plus funding programmed for the non-trustee organizations. In regards to 97100, no attempt has been made to distribute the funding across line-items.

Personnel

• As proposed, the *continuing projects* request a total of 170.2 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) positions and \$8,043,700 in personal services which equates to 45.4% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.

- As proposed, the *new projects* request a total of 104.7 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) positions and \$5,883,400 in personal services which equates to 29.1% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- The DPD instructions required that each proposal provide a list of key personnel who
 will be working on the project and a description of their responsibilities. The budget
 instructions required that the individual be identified. Numerous proposals included
 neither.
- While I didn't keep count, I would guess that the budgets include \$100,000 to \$150,000 in personnel services for attendance at the various conferences and the EVOS workshops, plus another \$100,000 for manuscripts.
- In regards to Project Management, it appears that the Alaska Department of Natural Resources and the Department of the Interior have ignored your directive to pull those costs associated with project management out of the budgets.

Travel

- As proposed, the total requested for *continuing projects* for travel is \$841,200 which equates to 4.8% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for travel within the *continuing projects*, roughly 60% is identified as field travel. The rest of the travel includes \$74,500 to attend conferences, \$178,300 to attend the various EVOS workshops and \$90,400 for what appears to be administrative travel.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* for travel is \$703,200 which equates to 3.5% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for travel within the *new projects*, roughly 62% is identified as field travel. The rest of the travel includes \$22,800 to attend conferences, \$189,200 to attend the various EVOS workshops and \$21,300 for what appears to be administrative travel.
- It appears that people are making a good effort at coordinating the restoration program, but I do wonder if the agencies are doing the same in relationship to other agency activity.
- While I recognize the importance of the various professional conferences, I can't help but think that the individuals would attend the conferences with or without Trustee Council funding.

Contractual

- As proposed, the total requested for *continuing projects* for contractual is \$5,155,600 which equates to 29.1% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- The total funding proposed as pass-through to non-trustee organizations for continuing projects is \$6,356,800 or 36% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for contractual within the *continuing projects*, approximately \$58,500 is identified for publications or reports, \$155,900 is requested for maintenance and repairs on equipment, \$30,100 for rental of equipment and \$30,600 has been included for training.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* for contractual is \$9,438,900 which equates to 46.6% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- The total funding proposed as pass-through to non-trustee organizations for new projects is \$15,893,800 or 78.5% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for contractual within the *new projects*, approximately \$9,400 is identified for publications or reports, \$14,300 is requested for maintenance and repairs on equipment, \$186,300 for rental of equipment and \$4,100 has been included for training.
- It appears people are making a good effort at coordinating the restoration program, but I do wonder if the agencies are doing the same in relationship to other agency activity.

Commodities

- As proposed, the total requested for *continuing projects* for commodities is \$896,200 which equates to 5.1% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for commodities within the *continuing projects*, approximately \$32,000 is requested to purchase software and \$49,800 is requested for office expenses.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* for commodities is \$545,200 which equates to 2.7% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- Of the total amount budgeted for commodities within the *new projects*, approximately \$5,300 is requested to purchase software and \$28,500 is requested for office expenses.

Equipment

- As proposed, the total requested for continuing projects for equipment is \$350,700 which equates to 2% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* for equipment is \$1,026,100 which equates to 5.1% of the total funding requested for new projects.
- With very few exceptions, the type of equipment that is being requested would have been purchased by the agencies and organizations regardless of the spill, and are necessary to fulfill their statutory responsibilities, or in the case of non-trustee organization maintain an edge on the competition.

General Administration

- As proposed, the total requested for *continuing projects* to reimburse agencies for indirect costs is \$1,341,100 which equates to 7.6% of the total funding requested for continuing projects. In addition, a total of \$1,085,900 has been requested by non-trustee organizations for indirect costs. The combination of general administration and indirect is \$2,427,000 which equates to 13.7% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* to reimburse agencies for indirect cost is \$1,034,400 which equates to 5.1% of the total funding requested for new projects. The combination of general administration and indirect is \$2,646,700 which equates to 16.7% of the total funding requested for continuing projects.

Indirect

- As proposed, the total requested for *continuing projects* by non-trustee organizations for indirect cost is \$1,085,900 which equates to 17.1% of the total funding requested by non-trustee organizations for continuing projects.
- As proposed, the total requested for *new projects* by non-trustee organizations for indirect cost is \$1,612,300 which equates to 10.1% of the total funding requested by non-trustee organizations for new projects.

You should also be aware that a number of the proposals, most notably the APEX projects, included a qualifier in regards to the proposed 1997 budgets. In simple terms, the numbers may change once the results of the 1996 field season have been analyzed.

In general, Trustee Council funding appears to have developed as a safety net for agencies and organizations which are being forced to live on reduced funds. While it

could be argued that the increase in the continuing projects represents a better estimate of the true costs, one could also argue that the agencies are supplanting general funds with settlement funds. This is not to say that the agencies are using settlement fund to support normal agency activities. For the most part, the proposals represent projects that would not have been conducted had the spill not occurred. However, agencies appear to be less willing to share in the cost of a project and possibly are looking to settlement funds to cover normal expenses.

In my opinion, the increase in the 1997 estimate is only the beginning. My forecast is that requests in future years will continue to mushroom. While we can be arbitrary and reduce the budgets or spend an enormous amount of time cutting small amounts here and there, only those closest to the project can assess if the budget is reasonable and appropriate given the objectives outlined in the Detailed Project Description.

Last year a number of budgetary items were highlighted, yet only a few of the suggested reductions were accepted by the recipients. I would recommend that this year the DRAFT Work Plan be developed in recognition of any identified budgetary reductions. Rather than have the recipients respond to specific reductions, have them address how the reduction will impact the proposed project.
