Enclosed is the draft manuscript describing the history of the Exxon Valdez settlement, the Trustee Council and the uses of the settlement money.

The manuscript, researched and written by former communications coordinator Joe Hunt, is currently titled "Mission Without a Map: Restoration following the Exxon Valdez oil spill." It is meant as a historical review of the politics, policies, and procedures of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council, including chapters describing settlement negotiations and damage assessment.

This document was based mostly on the public record. It uses 10 years of Trustee Council and Public Advisory Group minutes, transcripts, documents, publications, and letters to tell the story of how restoration decisions were made. It is an attempt to cull the most important events, comments, and archived documents from a large 10-year administrative record. Ideally, any person or group looking for lessons from the Trustee Council's experience will begin with this thoroughly documented report.

Just as annual and final reports are peer reviewed, this report will face critical and editorial review by the University of California Press. After review, an editorial board for the UC Press will decide whether it will publish the report as a book. Funds are in the Draft FY 2002 Work Plan for the Trustee Council to either self-publish the report or subsidize the costs of printing the report as a book. The final manuscript must be submitted to the UC Press in September of this year in order to have it printed by

September of next year (in time for the end of the TC Work Plans and the beginning of GEM).

Your review of this draft is requested in order to have it in the best shape possible before submitting it to UC Press. In order to have time to make necessary changes and updates, your comments must be received no later than September 4.

### Deadline for Comments: September 4, 2001

Your comments, suggestions, corrections, additions, and edits are welcome. You can forward your comments in writing in one of two ways:

- 1) Write directly on the manuscript. Large gutters have been left on each page to provide room for comments, edits, etc.
- 2) Write comments on a separate sheet of paper or e-mail. If you use this method, always reference the PAGE NUMBER and PARAGRAPH you are referring to.

Comments should be returned to the Restoration Office no later than the posted deadline. Any edits/comments received earlier would be greatly appreciated. You can also return your comments chapter by chapter.

I realize that this draft provides only a short time for your review. I personally have been through the draft three times. If there are serious issues or concerns on your part, we will of course work to resolve them. This may mean a delay in the report's publication, but we'll deal with that if necessary. Thank you very much for your help and support.

The project management target for a \$4-5 million work plan is significantly less than what was authorized for project management in FY 01.

A decision on whether or not any project management funds will be provided once funding has shifted to GEM (FY 03 and beyond) has not yet been made. It is imperative that agencies and individuals plan for the possibility that no funding will be provided for project management after FY 02.

### Comments on Each Agency

**DOI:** Number of projects (10) and total funding (\$1,010,800) is roughly same as FY 01; Two of these projects are deferred and may or may not be funded. Four of the projects are new and three are closeout. As a federal agency, DOI may have NEPA responsibility for some state projects as well as its own projects.

NOAA: Number of projects (18) is roughly the same as FY 01 but total funding (\$1,160,700) is significantly less. Eight of these projects are deferred and may or may not be funded. Seven of the projects are new and six are closeouts. As a federal agency, NOAA may have NEPA responsibility for some state projects as well as its own projects. In addition, NOAA administers the Trustee Council's BAA process, through which eight projects are recommended for funding in FY 02 (five of the eight are deferred). [NOTE: The eight BAAs will generate about \$38,000 in GA for NOAA.]

**USFS:** Only one project is recommended for funding in FY 02. As a federal agency, USFS may have NEPA responsibility for some state projects as well as its own project.

**ADEC:** Only two projects are recommended for funding in FY 02 and one of these is deferred. Management needs on two capital projects -- 99304/Kodiak Waste Management Plan funded in FY 99 and 02514/Lower Cook Inlet Waste Management Plan under consideration for funding in FY 02 -- should be funded through those projects' budgets.

**ADF&G:** Number of projects (20) is only slightly less than in FY 01 but total funding (\$1,462,500) is significantly less than in FY 01. Five of these projects are deferred and may or may not be funded. Eight projects are new and four are closeouts. In addition, ADF&G administers the Council's bench fee contract with the Alaska SeaLife Center.

The Trustee Council supported four projects at the ASLC in FY 01; two or three are recommended for support in FY 02. [NOTE: In FY 01, the ASLC bench fees generated \$31,800 in GA for ADF&G; with fewer projects in FY 02, the amount of GA may be less but has not yet been determined.]

ADNR: Only one project is recommended for funding and it is deferred. In addition, ADNR administers the Chief Scientist's contract on behalf of the Trustee Council. Management needs on the archaeological repository capital project (Project 99154) should be funded through that project's budget. [NOTE: The Chief Scientist's contract will generate about \$18,000 in GA for ADNR.]

Most agencies, in addition to having lead agency responsibility for specific projects, also receive funds for some other projects. Project management costs are estimated based on lead agency responsibilities only.

Each agency also receives funding through the Project 02100/Administration budget. My recommendation on liaison funding under Project 02100 will remain at two months per agency for FY 02 only. A decision on whether or not any liaison funds will be provided once funding has shifted to GEM (FY 03 and beyond) has not yet been made. Agencies participating in the Trustee Council's habitat protection program also receive funding support through Project 02126. Each agency also receives general administration (GA) funds to cover additional program costs.

I appreciation your cooperation as the amount of funding available for the restoration program lessens and we continue to take steps to reduce our overall operating costs. Please give me a call if you have questions about this memo or wish to discuss it further.
