I applaud your approval last September of Project 94320 for planning an Ecosystem Study in Prince William Sound. I hope you will continue your support by approving Project 94147 Comprehensive Monitoring Program.

I believe approval of Project 94266 Shoreline Assessment and Oil Removal is critical to the recovery of the Region.

While the ecosystem is being studied and residual oil is assessed and removed I would like to see the Trustee Council approve Projects 94163, 94165, 94166, studies related to Pacific Herring; Projects 94163, 94184, 94185, 94187, 98189, 94191, 94192 relating to Pink Salmon; Projects 94137, 94139, 94259, 94280, 94345, 94421 for Commercial Fisheries.

The distressed fisheries have had an impact that reaches much further than the Public Non Profit Aquaculture Corporations. The effects are also felt by the fishermen, Commercial as well as Sport, Subsistence, and Personal Use. The communities, from the people who process the fish; to the suppliers of services, gear, and groceries; to the citizens whose cities have lost seafood processing companies due to bankruptcy; residents due to lack of employment opportunities; and revenues due to the dramatic drop in raw fish tax, also feel the devastation.

One hope the people have to hang onto is that the salmon enhancement programs will be able to restore and replace the lost resources. In order to accomplish this recovery of the region, the Aquaculture Corporations must have assistance through these difficult times just to maintain their current programs. The budgets have been cut to bare bones, and then cut more. The lack of scheduled maintenance is going to be severely felt in the future because of cuts already executed. Loan and interest payments have been deferred. The quality of programs has been at risk because of the extreme budget cuts. Now, the basic existence of enhancement programs are quite seriously threatened. It would be a crime to allow the Aquaculture Corporations to go bankrupt like some of the Cordova seafood processors, related businesses and fishermen already have since 1989.

The most cost effective way to address residual oil is to leave it on the beaches. I believe its removal to encompasses more than Subsistence and Recreation Resources. I believe residual oil effects the birds both migrating and local, the terrestrial mammals, and marine life whenever there is a wind and tide similar to the one that originally put the oil on the beach. Members of the EVOS Trustee Council:

I am writing in support of EVOS Trustee Council funding for **Project Number 94421, Common Property Salmon Stock Restoration**, in the Draft 1994 Work Plan. In particular, I ask for full funding to maintain the existing salmon enhancement and restoration system operated in the Prince William Sound bioregion by the Prince William Sound Aquaculture Corporation (PWSAC).

Prince William Sound salmon fisheries are distressed. During the ten years prior to 1989, the average annual return of all salmon to the PWS management region was 22 million fish. Total natural and hatchery salmon returns have dwindled to 10.5 million in 1992 and 7.0 million in 1993, in response to ecosystem changes that require further investigation. The damaged salmon resources and the lost services provided by those resources have heavily impacted all user groups. Revenues to PWSAC, primarily dependent on sales of returning fish, have fallen far short of what is necessary to maintain its restoration and enhancement efforts.

While the extent of short- and long-term damage to the Prince William Sound ecosystem is still being assessed, it is more important than ever to the people of the Sound that the salmon enhancement programs be maintained to both restore and replace these lost resources and services. The economic viability of the entire Prince William Sound region will be devastated if the hatchery system is allowed to fail during this period of distress.

Because of the extent of the economic hardship in the region, it is also appropriate to ask the EVOS Trustee Council funds to repay the PWSAC debt to the State Aquaculture Revolving Loan Fund, in addition to the funding request for 1994.

Please help the resources and the people of Prince William Sound recover.

Mr. President:

Last spring I watched a young robin fly against the glass of a window again and again. Realizing he was attacking his image, I hung a covering behind the window, as it was too high to cover from the outside, in attempt to dissolve the image being reflected. To no avail, as a few days later the body of the robin lay at the base of the building.

In the turmoil of decision making, one often searches for basic truths for guidance, such as wisdom, knowledge and love. The bible tells us that love is the greatest of these and I believe this to be true. These precepts I have tried to hold as a mental foundation in dealing with Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. I am a commercial fisherman in Prince William Sound, (PWS) but before that a Fish and Wildlife Protection Officer responsible for the same area. When the oil spill occurred I was hired by the State of Alaska, Department of Environmental Conservation to fly PWS daily, tracking the progress of the oil movement and prevent oil dispersant from being mistakenly sprayed on herring. This and my following job kept me in the air for nearly all the daylight hours for the first four weeks of the spill. I say this to gain credibility for my observations.

Many changes have happened in PWS since that devastating day in March 1989. It has caused myself and many others great concern and prompted this letter being drafted at 4am on a sleepless night. If I may sir, I would like to share these concerns with you.

There is much publicity within the media stating PWS is clean, healthy and all is well. Nothing could be further from the truth. There is genetic damage to the pink salmon, in documented reports by both Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game and NOAA. Our herring biomass has lost its' entire 1989 year class and was over 100,000 tons short of expected levels last spring. Our pink salmon run has gone from 25 million fish down to 6 million. The economy of PWS has been devastated. The migrating mammals that use PWS have either stopped using the Sound or do so in very small numbers.

I could go on for many pages concerning the damages but the main purpose of the letter is more important. That sir, is our failure to scientifically measure PWS when the oil pipeline was built, to establish a data base for evaluating such an occurrence, as a spill, and what we are not doing now...to evaluate the long term effects of such an action. This is wrong and irresponsible. The world community is looking to us to lead them in knowledge and concern for our world environment and we are being found wanting.

It is not in our States' (Alaska) best interest, as we are budget dependent on oil nor our Governments' as we are energy dependent on oil, to require responsibility of the oil industry for their actions. The blockade of Valdez Narrows to tanker traffic last August was a desperate attempt by a desperate people to bring their plight before you and the Nation. Four years have gone by and the lack of action by the Trustee Council (EVOS) is very visible. A request for funding to study the basic ecosystems food chain will be presented to EVOS on January 31, 1994. If I may sir, request your input of concern in this matter and in requiring EXXON to be responsible to the people of PWS and Alaska. We are suffering an economic disaster from this spill and it is wrong.

The main concern is for our existance on earth as we know it. If the dependancy on oil or the greed for money overshadows our responsibility as stewards of this earth, then our existance shall have been for naught. Then perhaps we shall be gone as the robin and for no less cause than attacking an image and precieved notions of unreality. Reality is the delicate balance of Gods' creation, our living earth, that we are a very important part of. We have the ability to alter this balance like no other inhabitant. Therefore our responsibility is the greatest. How shall we measure up over time will determine our childrens existance and that of our world.

Once again please urge the EVOS council to fund the scientific study of the basic food chain ecosystem in PWS. EVOS will address this issue January 31, 1994. Also I would urge you to assist the people of PWS in requiring EXXON to deal with the devastating financial crisis they have brought upon this area.

Our group represents fishermen that participate in fisheries throughout the state. Many of our members fish in both the salmon and herring fisheries in Kodiak, Prince William Sound and Cook Inlet. It is at their request that we are submitting these comments on the 1994 Draft Work Plan.

We support the following projects:

Project 94345. Research in Lower Cook Inlet (LCI) is needed to determine the streamlife of returning adult pink salmon. These stocks of the Outer District in Lower Cook Inlet are at historic low levels. Monitoring is necessary to facilitate their recovery.

Project 94421. Due to the oil spill, hatchery returns in PWS and LCI have declined substantially. Operations of the hatcheries are assured by cost recovery sales of returning adults. Presently those returns are too low to fund hatchery operations and hatchery closures are imminent. Adult returns are beginning to increase and funding of the hatcheries will assure their continued operation as the survival rate return to normal levels. We support funding for Tutka Hatchery and PWSACC hatcheries.

Project 94259. These projects will increase the spawning habitat of proven salmon streams in the spill area. It will help mitigate the damages in the intertidal zones that many of the salmon utilize for spawning.

Projects 94258, 94255, 94504. Researching damage and improving management of the Kenai River Stocks will benefit many residents and fishermen in Alaska. These projects must be funded to restore the Kenai River Sockeye to prespill levels.

Projects 94163, 94165, 9416. The 1993 herring season was a disaster, and all indications point to EVOS as the primary contributor either directly or through prey mortality. This is an important fishery to many of our members and an understanding of the problems and solutions is critical.

Projects 94184, 94185, 94187, 94189, 94191, 94192. These projects will help determine the extent of damages to pink salmon in PWS. Recovery of hatchery stocks may be faster than natural recovery; management of low resident stocks will be a difficult job for state fishery managers. Research into stock separation and identification will make management simpler. Furthermore research in PWS will be applicable to other spill areas and there will be greater benefit.

Project 94241 Rockfish management is difficult due to their slow growth rate and longevity. The oil spill has had an impact on the populations of rockfish and better data is necessary to determine harvest rates so these species are not overfished.

In general our organization is in favor of continued research into the effects of EVOS on sealife resources. We do believe that the time has come to increase the priority of restoration of damaged resources and the monitoring of their recovery.

We are opposed to the following project.

Project 94199. Alaska Sea Life Center. This project is closely tied with funds that are dedicated to a more tourist oriented facility. Funding amounts must be established to better evaluate the benefit to cost aspect of this project. Originally the amount of money needed was far too high to justify its expenditure on a facility of such limited use. We believe that the purpose of these funds will be inseparable from the tourist oriented portion of the facility and it will lose its research priority. In addition funds of this amount should be utilized to restore damaged resources and private funds should be used to establish a tourist facility.

I would like to submit the following comments on several projects in the 1994 Work Plan.

Project 94345 Salmon Spawning Escapement Lower Kenai Peninsula.

Little has been done to determine the damage done to salmon streams, habitat and long term effects of the EVOS in Lower Cook Inlet. This research to more accurately pinpoint stream life of returning adult salmon and calibrate aerial survey data is necessary. It will help determine why salmon runs on the outer Kenai coast are failing. I support this project.

Project 94421 Common Stock Hatchery Restoration.

EVOS has been determined to have had detrimental effects on pink salmon in the spill area. Returns to hatcheries in Cook Inlet and Prince William Sound have diminished greatly after the oil spill and are just now beginning to show some signs of recovery. Because these common property hatcheries are funded by the sale of fish returning to them, the reduction in survival rates have put hatchery operations in jeopardy. Tutka hatchery is just now beginning to show a recovery in survival to adult, but funding may force its closure. A short term method to finance its operation while the ecosystem and pink survival rates recover is a legitimate use of EVOS money. I support this project.

Project 94259 Salmon Instream Habitat and Stock Restoration

In Lower Cook Inlet the outer Kenai Peninsula was heavily impacted by EVOS. Much of the prime spawning area was inundated by weathered oil which attached itself to the bottom. Because salmon in the area utilize intertidal areas as spawning habitat damage has occurred that is not easily quantified. One of the projects in this group would increase spawning area by creating a spawning channel in Port Dick. Pink and Chum salmon returns have fallen dramatically in the past few years. The average odd year harvest (pre EVOS) for the past 15 years for pinks in Port Dick is 505,000 fish. In 1993 the harvest of pinks was 27,000 fish. For chums in Port Dick pre EVOS the 15 year average harvest was 20,700 and the harvest for 1993 was 970 fish. There is something significantly wrong in this area. This project will help in restoring the salmon stocks in Port Dick.

Projects 94258, 94255, 94504 Kenai River Sockeye research

I support all of these projects. Overescapement is the primary cause of the decline of sockeye stocks in the Kenai River.

Research into the recovery rate and the management of mixed fishery stocks will accelerate the recovery of the Kenai River sockeye. This will benefit commercial, sport and subsistence fishermen.

Projects relating to Pink salmon and herring research in PWS should also be funded. This research will also benefit effected salmon and Herring stocks throughout the spill area.

In addition, projects that research damaged populations of birds and mammals will also provide valuable data. Habitat acquisition is also an important part of the restoration of all damaged species.

Project 94199      Alaska Sea Life Center

I am opposed to this project. Even with the re-write of this project it is still tourist oriented. The actual value of a location for logistical support is just a smokescreen to acquire funding. The original funding request was far too high and now there is not a definite amount of money requested. If there is not an actual plan or funding amount, this plan should be rejected and not funded. This is a very large sum of money to allocate to one project that has poorly defined objectives that are contrary to the use of EVOS funds. The EVOS funds must be used to restore damaged resources and not to create jobs and economic benefit.


With regard to the 1994 Draft Work Plan for Restoration from the affects of the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill of 1989 and specifically Projects No. 94345, 94421 and 94139 as they relate to Lower Cook Inlet and the outer Kenai Peninsula coast; As a commercial fisherman who earns his livelihood from the waters of the Kenai Peninsula, I strongly support the projects proposed for this area but would encourage you to consider the fact that our coastline was damaged second only to Prince William Sound but we have not received a proportionate amount of attention or consideration with regard to allocation of resources for restoration. As a matter of fact, we have received only token attention thus far because we are few in numbers and our voice has not been heard. I implore you to give our area equal consideration for meaningful projects and not to be moved by sheer numbers or political expediency alone.

I also disagree strongly with the conclusion that one may draw from reading Project No. 94345, in that it may suggest that our salmon stocks were not damaged because "persistent injury has not been documented for salmon in this area". I have fished this area many years prior to the spill and have unsuccessfully attempted to fish the outer coast since the spill. As this area has historically produced significant runs of wild chum and pink salmon on a consistent basis and since the oil spill has not produced harvestable surpluses for a single year, it is safe to say that the spill, if not totally, contributed to a major extent to the decline of our salmon stocks.

The residual damage to our fisheries habitat continues to be felt and can be minimized or mitigated through meaningful restoration activities. But it won't be of any benefit locally if projects are allocated for regional economic stimulation or political appeasement. I sincerely urge you to consider allocation of projects on an "actual damages / real needs" basis only. I submit that our area was heavily damaged and should receive priority consideration for assignment of restoration resources and allocation of projects.

Thank you for your time and effort you have devoted personally and collectively to this most urgent task. We Alaska citizens are indebted to you for your selfless public service.

Please explain the review process of the proposed projects described in the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Restoration Draft 1994 Work Plan. I understand that the document is available for public comment. However, I am specifically interested in the professional scientific review, including the names and affiliations of the reviewers.

On Page 59 of the 1994 Draft Work Plan, it is stated that in many cases the project monies will be spent within the Trustee Agencies where the agency mandate and personnel skills are mirrored by project objectives. It is mentioned that there will be some non-agency investigators selected through request for proposals.

What is the process by which agencies are granted some projects, and others will be put out for open proposals? Are not all projects subject to an open, competitive, peer-review proposal process? At a time when our governments are growing beyond budgets, our education system is underfunded, and there is a growing consensus that privatization of government functions is highly desirable, preferential funding of agencies over university and private researchers is antithetical to the will and interests of the public. I hope this is not the case here.

Please consider this letter as commentary on the work plan for the final plan development. In addition, please respond to my questions regarding the peer review process.



It can also supply a place where Alaskans and others can learn about our marine environment.*

*The proposed site of the SeaLife Center is uniquely suited to scientific study. There is deep, pure water abundantly available, there is ample space for it on donated land, and the University Institute of Marine Science is right next door.*

*I do feel the Alaska Sea Life Center is the best use of oil spill settlement funds. And though I feel that land and timber aquisition is totally useless as far as their possible impact on marine mammals, fish and birds is concerned I am not asking that money not be spent on those projects, so I am very annoyed that supporters of have spoken out against the Sea Life Center. Those people are short-sighted and have some romantic view of Alaska returning to what it was before they came here.*

Dear Trustees:

I have had the opportunity to visit Scripps Institute of Oceanography, the Long Labs at Santa Cruz, California, and other marine science facilities, and to get behind the scenes and see how they work. I firmly believe that the Alaska SeaLife Center (Project 94199), could become as important to Alaska as those facilities are to their areas.

Alaska has long needed a facility with the scope of Scripps and Woods Hole, but there has never been the money to accomplish this. I firmly believe that the best use of the money derived from the tragic Exxon-Valdez oil spill would be to fund the building of a Scripps/Woods Hole. We need to know more about our marine ecosystems so that we may enhance our fisheries--find out why stocks dwindle in certain areas at certain times. Are they related to pollution?

Alaska will soon be feeling the effects of less oil production, just as we are now suffering the effects of the decline in per barrel price of oil. It is increasingly important that we find alternatives to oil revenue, and to find ways to enhance the financial impact of our fisheries industry. That can only be done by scientific research.

We must learn why sea lion populations and sea bird populations are in trouble. If we do not more and more species will be placed on the endangered lists and fishermen will have to forage farther and farther from the rookeries. Eventually even the day tour visits into Prince William Sound and Kenai Fjords National Park may have to be halted because the birds and sea mammals will have to be more drastically protected in their breeding and nesting areas. We could in effect lose the very industries that might possibly fill some of the financial burden that oil has represented for the past 20 years.

The projected scope of the SeaLife Center closely matches what is needed to study these creatures. The project has the full support of the University of Alaska, in fact the president of the University himself appeared at a meeting earlier this month to urge that funding be approved for the Center. It isn't often that university presidents appear themselves in support of a project, that is usually left to others. Certainly this measure of support on his behalf is significant and deserves attention.

It is also significant that Dr. Spies has endorsed the Alaska SeaLife Center project. Too often the Trustees have been

criticised for not following the advice of their own scientific advisors. In this case you will have done just that--approved a project that is a priority with Dr. Spies.


The Alaska SeaLife Center will sit in a prime area for marine studies--next to the existing University of Alaska Institute of Marine Science, right on the waterfront on land donated by the City of Seward. Water off the dock is over 200 feet deep and pure, high with nutrients. Just beyond the entrance to Resurrection Bay lies Kenai Fjords National Park and some two dozen sea mammal and bird rookeries.

In addition the Center can provide a place where stranded animals can be studied, treated, and returned to the wild. If such a facility had been in place during the hectic days following the Exxon-Valdez spill, creatures could have been treated while in the early stages of distress rather than waiting until they were nearly dead. Also, all the known data on treatment for various kinds of stress to animals could be located in one place, ready to respond to any kind of emergency.

Lastly, I find no fault with the center being able to support itself through public education and public viewing. Scripps and Long Labs have paid public viewing that supports their programs. Other scientific facilities have public viewing for that purpose. The capacity to educate the public about the sea and the life it supports is of critical importance if we are to have a human population that respects and nurtures its wildlife.

Again, I urge you to approve funding for the Alaska SeaLife Center. It will be a lasting legacy of the work you are doing.

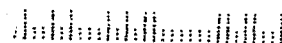

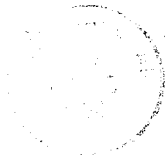

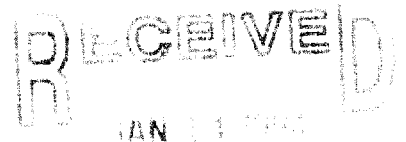

I would like to write in favor of Project 94199. I believe that it represents the best use of oil spill settlement funds. I grew up in Southcentral Alaska and have lived and worked in several areas impacted by the Exxon Valdez oil spill. I really care about the future of the ecosystems of Alaska.

Merely buying up timber and real estate is not going to help us in any way if (really when) another disaster happens. We need IN PLACE, facilities and personnel, who have the capability of predicting where a spill might go, how best to try to clean up a spill (or whether cleaning is the answer at all), and how to treat animals that have been harmed.

Things that could be studied right now include: why are the shells of seabirds so fragile right now?, why are the populations of Stellar sea lions dwindling?, why are other species of birds, sea mammals and fish dwindling? We know that some of these things were happening or began happening even before the oil spill, but some were certainly worsened by the catastrophe.

I am not an "Alaska-Come-Lately" who knows all the answers to Alaska's problems, but I do know that we have an obligation to find out as much as we can to enable us to work toward enhancing the health and well-being of those birds, sea mammals and fish. The oil production business is winding down and our financial picture in Alaska is darkening. For those reasons I think it is a good thing that the 94199 project will be able to support itself as well as endow chairs to support further learning.

Despite your listing of projects in the General Restoration Project (Table 2) it is apparent most are truly monitoring or continuing studies. I started figuring the % of projects which "restore, enhance, rehabilitate or acquire equivalent resources" to quote your own document but it was too depressing-depressingly low.

IT is quite clear this money is being used by agencies + contractors to pay for pet studies - studies which are NOT helping restore the oil spill area in the slightest way. Sure, they could be used eventually to be a base of info for restoration projects, but here we are 1994 - 5 YEARS after the spill + you are still spending the vast majority on studies or administration (5.5 million on administration?!!! 16% of the budget. 12% is generally felt to be excessive overhead. And this 16% doesn't cover the overhead in each project! Really, you should be embarrassed. Me, I'm argu. I F I had the money or was a lawyer, I'd sue. This is misappropriation of funds.

You should be spending a much higher percentage of available funds on true restoration, on the ground projects that really do something. And no, you cannot argue that you need to study the situation 15% and agencies such as

The USFS + ARF+G have been doing projects for years - based on best professional knowledge. They don't study it to death. They do monitor after the project, but the way you're going you'll be out of money before you ~~even~~ actually do the project - certainly not have money to monitor your results. So get out there + do something. To quote Teddy Roosevelt "It is not the critic who counts, not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the door of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marked by dust + sweat + blood; who strives valiantly; who errs + comes short again + again; because there is no effort without error + shortcomings but who actually strives to do the deeds."

So get out there + do the projects based on best judgement. Adid if you're wrong, well you are better to have tried + failed than to have never tried at all.

Enough studies - get out there + restore like you have been directed to.

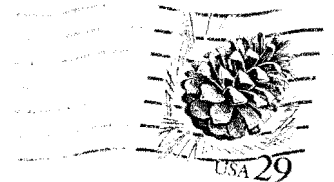
