Dear Sirs:

I am writing to congratulate you on concluding the Exxon Valdez settlement by purchasing 30,000 acres on the Kenai Fjords coastline held by EBC. Kenai Fjords includes the only fjord system in the U.S., plus coastal ecosystems, icefields, and rainforests, and all the wildlife they contain. Acquiring these parcels for Kenai Fjords will make the park and its resident wildlife much more secure in the coming years.

From the tragedy of the Exxon Valdez, an opportunity has arisen to permanently protect critical habitat for the public and provide Native Corporation shareholders with financial resources for their future. I urge you to negotiate similar agreements with Port Graham and other corporations that own critical parcels within the spill damage zone. I am referring to the other portion of Kenai Fjords currently owned by a Native Alaskan corporation, near the town of Port Graham on the opposite side of the park. It is within the spill damage zone, and therefore, is also eligible to be bought with funds from the settlement. Restoration of the resources so horribly damaged by the Valdez spill has always been one of the goals of the settlement fund. Extending the park to its "desired" boundary, so that it remains free from development, would be an ideal way to meet this goal. I appreciate the time and effort you have put into this process. Great job!

It is of concern to me that resource and wildlife restoration, from the Exxon spill, is the only priority for these settlement funds. Again thank you and keep up the great work!





Nearly 80,000 acres in Kenai Fjords National Park, including much of the coastline, awaits conveyance to two Native village corporations. But Park Service officials hope to buy the land or the selection rights to it with money from the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill Trustee Council.

The Park Service might be ready to present an acquisition package to the trustee council at its Nov. 2 meeting, if it can set a price with the village corporations of English Bay and Port Graham, said Chuck Gilbert, lands chief for the agency.

The trustee council, funded with \$900 million to be paid over 10 years by Exxon, works to restore resources damaged in the 1989 oil spill. An undefined amount of that money, perhaps several million dollars, will be spent buying habitat, according to the final restoration plan.

Anne Castellina, park superintendent, said the agency wants to keep the park intact as a single ecosystem. "It would be a blow to lose the coastlands. They're the heart of the park."

Land conveyed to the Native corporations could be developed as private property or put off limits, she said. Port Graham is considering a wilderness lodge at Pederson Lagoon, said Peter Fitzmaurice, supervisory park ranger.

Under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971,

Native village and regional corporations were given the right to select land. Port Graham selected 45,670 acres in what would become Kenai Fjords National Monument in 1978 and a national park in 1980. And English Bay selected 31,458 acres.

Although the Native selections predate the park, the land is still federal land, managed by the Park Service. "We have a great obligation to consult with them if we plan to do something," Fitzmaurice said.

There has been some prehistoric use of the park area by Natives for fishing and whale hunting, and there is one village site on the lands, Castellina said. "Some older folks in English Bay and Port Graham were told of grandparents born in Aialik Bay," she said.

The Park Service has been working on the land deals for the past two years, Gilbert said. The first appraisals were rejected by the Park Service because they weren't done correctly, he said. They have been revised and resubmitted. Officials would not give dollar figures for the appraisals.

Representatives of the village corporations did not return telephone calls. Castellina said Port Graham Natives want to have the land conveyed before selling any of it, because they want to retain some of it. English Bay Natives originally wanted to sell all of their land but are now having second thoughts, she said.

It would be quicker to buy the
selection rights, rather than go to
conveyance and buy the land,
Castellina said. But if the Park
Service gets funding from the
trustee council, it could hold onto
the money until conveyance, she
said.

A further complication is that
if the land is conveyed, the Park
Service will have to negotiate
easements for public access to
parklands, even if it intends to
buy the land later. "There are sev-
eral things going on at once,"
Fitzmaurice said. "It's our opti-
mistic hope that the trustee coun-
cil will buy the lands."

The trustee council has a
working group that rates poten-
tial land buys as they relate to
restoring resources damaged in
the oil spill. "We have spent end-
less hours working with the
trustee council in terms of rating
parcels in the park, seeing which
ones have the most species
affected by the spill," Castellina
said.

Of the parcels over 1,000
acres, only 3,800 acres at James
Lagoon, selected by English Bay,
are ranked high by the trustee
council for restoration value. But
six parcels, totaling 44,500 acres,
are ranked of moderate value.

A 1990 Park Service study
estimated that about 11 miles of
the park's 430-mile coast were
oiled by the spill, and there were
effects on marine life as the oil
moved along the coast.

But oily lands are not the ori-
entia for trustee council land
buys. The trustees are looking for
pristine habitat that supports
species damaged in the spill.
"Land acquisition and land pro-
tection is really a good way to see
these populations come back,"
said Tabitha Gregory of the
Alaska Center for the
Environment.

The Seward oil spill zone
from Cape Pogo to Gore Point
has gotten nothing from the
trustee council so far, except for a
few bird studies, Castellina said.
"We really haven't seen anything
for our portion of the spill."

Both the park land buys and
the proposed Alaska Sea Life
Center are good restoration
efforts for the Seward zone,
Castellina said. "And both are
extremely significant for the
economy of this town."

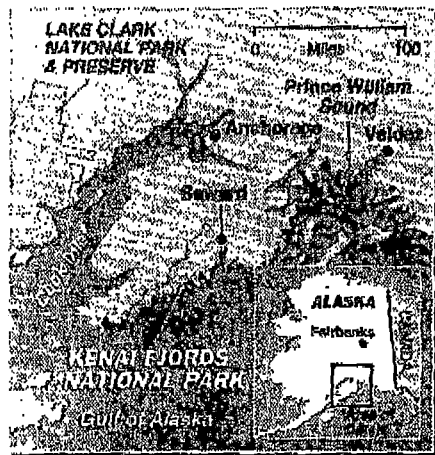

Park Service Seeks To Buy Alaska Land

By JOHN H. CUSHMAN Jr.

THE National Park Service is negotiating with Alaska natives to buy tens of thousands of acres of wilderness, paying for it with money collected from the Exxon Corporation as compensation for damages caused by the huge oil spill in Prince William Sound off Valdez in 1989.

"We are hoping to be able to put forward a package of proposed acquisitions by summer," said John Quinley, a spokesman for the park service, which is reviewing appraisals of the property.

The land, which is controlled by two Alaska native corporations, is situated within the Kenai Fjords National Park, a spectacular length of coastline that lies below a glacier field and stretches for hundreds of miles along a peninsula southeast of Anchorage. The park encompasses 650,000 acres of federally owned land.

The park's shores were coated with oil after the Exxon Valdez ran aground in Prince William Sound to the northeast, spilling 11 million gallons of oil.

Damage to wildlife in the area was extensive.

As part of a broad legal settlement with the

company, Federal and state agencies have received hundreds of millions of dollars in compensation for the damage that the oil spill did to publicly owned natural resources. In all, Exxon has paid some \$3 billion in damages so far.

Using some of the Federal share of that money, Mr. Quinley said, the park service wants to buy huge tracts of land inside the Kenai park.

The land is controlled by the Port Graham Corporation and the English Bay Corporation, two entities representing native people who hold rights to the land under settlements ceding land to tribal organizations.

Buying that land is an attractive deal for the park system because the native holdings inside the park are neither icy glacier nor rocky shore, but rather forested lowlands suitable either for development or for recreational use.

The park service already owns 54 million acres in Alaska, or 15 percent of the state, much of it in eight national parks.

The Kenai park is easily accessible from Seward, and is one of the few places in Alaska where visitors can walk right up to a glacier.

Most visitors to the Kenai park, however, spend most of their time cruising just off shore. Tour operators based in Seward provide daylong sightseeing expeditions along the fjords, where visitors see birds, whales, sea lions, otters and sometimes bears along the coast.

There is also sport fishing in these waters, and a growing interest in kayaking in several of the bays.

Campgrounds and hiking areas are accessible by road from Seward, and the park service has some cabins near the bays, accessible by boat or plane.

But the park service has been worried about how the native corporations might eventually choose to develop their holdings. Two obvious choices would have been to cut timber on the land or to develop tourist attractions inside the park.

The native corporations own about 75,000 acres in the park, Mr. Quinley said, but the park service may not be able to buy it all.

"There is probably more land on the table than money," he said.
