a. update on oiling issue

-Nowlin:

- now identifying state personnel who can work on this;
- has been working with Bob Spies on this; Bob will be in Alaska soon to consult further;
- expects to lay out assignments and schedule when Bob is here.

-Gertler: what kind of assignments being made?

-Nowlin:

- not planning to ask PIs for their time right now;
- hopes that other agency staff will do it.

-Brodersen: working with accountants to explore mechanism for paying for overtime to get data on oil on water (A/W #1) finalized and provide to PIs on tape or on maps for those who need it.

-Gertler: how will resolve discrepancies between DEC oil on water data and the HAZMAT model?

-Nowlin: will be resolved through process now being set up.

-Brodersen: may not be huge discrepancies to resolve.

-Gertler: do we need to give interim guidance to PIs about whether to work with one or both data sets?

-Spies: suggested joint memo from Bob and Roy summarizing status before end of June.

b. Update on information release

-Steele:

- committee has had one meeting;
- narrowed down scope to 5 or so issue areas;
- overall issue is information management, not just data release;
- first topic on which committee focused was newsletter/news release/news conference idea;
- interim report due to MT in mid-June;
- legal/NRDA aspects must be fully considered, but should not constrain initial discussion of options;

-Morris: is symposium idea dead?

-Steele: no, although probably not a live prospect for next year's spill anniversary date (24 March 1992); timing is issue.

-Gertler: should committee consider specifically a process for review and publication of data by individual PIs?

-lots of discussion about peer review and whether it serves legal

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or academic interests?

-Swiderski: Dept. of Law would be very concerned about any releases absent a settlement.

-Senner: this task is premature for the committee. The committee's charge is to explore broader issues; this specific task might be a more appropriate follow up.

-Swiderski: draft scientific publications could be discoverable, and it is not desirable to unnecessarily have such material sitting around waiting to be discovered.

-reports prepared for litigation are not the same as papers prepared for publication in scientific journals

-[missed a few comments]

-Morris: cited example of NMFS release of trawl survey data (NRDA data), which is standard operating procedure for NMFS; O'Connor approved release, so they did.

-lots of negative reaction to this. Why was it released at all?

-need written guidance/policy about data release: Alex and Maria to look at this. May already have been written; need to check.

-Gertler: is Byron willing to hold up release, if it is not already out?

-Morris: yes.

-back to original question from Gertler: committee should look at scientific publication issue at generic level.

c. Restoration work assignments

-Gertler: has RPWG considered damage assessment schedule with respect to restoration schedule?

-Senner: yes--we want to be fully integrated with damage assessment schedule, but need to review the specific schedule to see if it is reasonable in terms of meeting restoration milestones.

-Gertler: how do we do a better job of restoration planning in terms of not changing signals, etc. and asked Susan to consider and report.

-MacMullin:

- restoration is buffeted about, but probably no more so than any other component of NRDA program;

- major need is Gulf of Alaska damages and restoration needs;

- fully integrate restoration with "pink book", etc.;

- need to work on terminology so that we always make clear that our language expresses that damage assessment, etc.; serves restoration as well as litigation;

- need to define in advance whether particularly studies will be considered under heading of restoration or damage assessment;

- especially on federal side, need to do more to consider budget needs for restoration planning in advance of budget decisions;

- need to develop restoration plan in advance of next round of settlement decisions: be ready; should have

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recommendations with costs included.

-Senner:

- concerned about putting dollar signs on an integrated plan:
 - this raises lots of policy questions about relative priorities;

- also raises concern about how we extrapolate injury info, which was primarily gathered in PWS, to full oil-spill area? We must extrapolate NRDA studies and integrate nonNRDA data;

- also need to know whether there is damage to recreation, for example; in the absence of NRDA data, what do we do?

-Gertler: need living document, which is holistic.

-Senner: described information needs meeting with RPWG and Bob Spies, which is now set for 12 June.

Gertler:

- need comments and suggested changes by close of business next week;

- want to finalize ASAP and get to Trustee Council.

1. Jim Nicoll will check with Justice attorneys in DC about the possibility of disposing of the birds in the freezers.

2. The Management Team designated a subgroup of the Management and Legal Teams and the Restoration Planning Work Group to prepare a report exploring opportunities, issues, and arguments on the topic of public information and scientific data release. A preliminary report is due to the Management Team by the week of June 17. Tim Steele is lead for this activity.

3. The subgroup on organizational change pre/post-settlement will give a brief description of its activities to the Trustee Council on 5/16/91. Dave Gibbons is lead.

4. The Management Team and the Restoration Planning Work Group will develop a comprehensive schedule for Oil Years 3 and 4 documents, e.g., successor to Pink Book (restoration and NRDA studies) and black book (budget for Oil Year 4 effort). Sandy Rabinowitch and Carol Gorbics will draft an integrated work group/management team schedule for review for 5/30/91 work group meeting.

5. The Restoration Planning Work Group may use the Forest Service's cost-share agreement with The Nature Conservancy to obtain this organizations assistance in developing the first step (e.g., identifying a process) for the habitat protection project. Ken Rice and Steve Bugbee will put this together.

6. Roy Nowlin and Bob Spies will begin working again on the standardization of oiling data among the various studies. The effort was suspended during settlement discussions.

It is necessary to change the date of the Management Team meeting scheduled for May 3, 1991, to accommodate the need to assist in responding to public comments on the settlement. I propose that we either meet this Thursday or Friday (April 25 or 26) or wait until the week of May 6. If we meet this week, we can work as a team to formulate responses to public comments. Please advise me of your preference as soon as possible.

As I understand it, the plan to deal with public comments on the settlement is as follows. Public comments will be categorized, indexed, sorted, and summarized by CACI and their product, in addition to the complete set of comments, will be provided to the Washington Policy Group and the Trustee Council on Wednesday morning (April 24). There will be a meeting at NOAA in Washington D.C. on Friday during which the Trustee Council will be conferenced called in to provide input. Dan Addison of NOAA will set up the time of the conference call and I will notify you when. Work will continue on responding to comments to ensure that the governments' responses are provided to the court by May 3, 1991. I will travel to Washington on April 30 to assist and will be back in Anchorage on May 6.

I am still working at scheduling the Trustee Council meeting on April 29, 1991, in Juneau to facilitate coordination of 1991 response activities. I would appreciate receipt of any information pertinent to the issue in order to prepare a complete briefing package for the Trustee Council. Please contact me by COB Wednesday.

I will attempt to consolidate the review of "Pink Book" document at the end of this week if I receive the documentation from each lead agency by Thursday. I will be forwarding a calendar of events/due dates/milestones later today or tomorrow.

Subject: Organizational Structure for Chief Scientist

We are pleased that all contractual arrangements are finalized and that Dr. Robert Spies is now the Chief Scientist for both federal and state damage assessment activities. To avoid confusion and to facilitate Dr. Spies' activities, we hereby confirm that Dr. Spies will function under the organizational structure prepared by the Washington Policy Group.

Dr. Spies will report directly to the Trustee Council. On a day-to-day basis, however, he will work directly with the Management and Legal Teams. Dr. Spies' activities are subject to the terms of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration-Alaska Department of Law Memorandum of Understanding regarding the Chief Scientist. He will be directly responsible for overseeing and planning science synthesis and peer review activities and in making specific recommendations to the Trustee agencies on the science program. The Management and Legal Teams will assist in the development of the proposed science review and synthesis program and will review it to ensure that programmatic and budgetary priorities are addressed. Following this review the program will be presented to the Trustee Council.

It is our belief that this structure will allow Dr. Spies to concentrate his efforts on the science program by establishing the Trustee Council as the single body that oversees his activities. The Management and Legal Teams will assist him in his efforts and will remain current on the progress of the science synthesis and peer review program. The Trustee Council will keep the Washington and State of Alaska Policy Groups advised of the science program. Dr. Spies will also continue to communicate with Dr. Doug Wolfe regarding the science program.

We recognize that this structure may change as a result of potential settlement of the civil case against Exxon. We anticipate that the need for the services of the Chief Scientist and the organization outlined above will continue at least through the 1991 field season.
