Dear Commissioner Katz:

At recent Alaska Water Resources Board meetings we have had recurring discussions on the difficulty of coordinating the Division of Geological and Geophysical Survey hydrological data collection program with the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities capital improvement projects. Alaska is finally funding hydrologic data collection at a level commensurate with the size and needs of this state, yet no mechanism exists that is insuring that the data collection program will be addressing the hydrologic data needs of the capital improvement program that is implemented by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

Our suggestion is that, along with coordinating your data collection program with the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities in the normal channels that we have recommended before, staff from the Division of Geological and Geophysical Survey, for example, or perhaps the Divisions of Land and Water Management or Research and Development analyze the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities capital improvement budget to determine what projects will have hydrologic data needs, both long-term and short-term, and in what parts of the state these needs will occur. This should be done annually and with assistance from the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. Done properly, this analysis will provide a basis from which the Division of Geological and Geophysical Survey can coordinate its activities with the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.
