On behalf of the Water Resources Board, I would like to welcome you to your new position as Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources. The Water Resources Board was established by the Water Use Act, passed in 1966 by the Legislature, to advise the Governor on all matters relating to the use of water. We invite you to discuss this at one of our meetings. Our next meeting tentatively scheduled December, 9-11 1981 in Soldotna.
