<u>2nd Proclamation</u> <u>Executive Order 846</u>	2/16/1909	Major changes in Forest Boundary. New boundary described and exceptions named. (Diagrammatic map in 3 sections filed in drafting.)	5

<u>3rd Proclamation</u> <u>Executive Order 1620</u>	2/7/1922	Eliminated Craig Town site, Tenakee Town site, Hyder Town site and Mendenhall Elimination	7
<u>Proclamation 1733</u>	2/26/1925	Glacier Bay Monument	7b
<u>Executive Order 3983</u>	4/1/1924	First withdrawal Glacier Bay National Monument	8
<u>4th Proclamation</u> <u>Executive Order 1742</u>	6/10/1925	Added Westside Lynn Canal, Excursion inlet to Cape Fairweather. Also Kasaan Peninsula, change circular areas around town sites to rectilinear areas. (Diagrammatic map filed in drafting.)	9
<u>Executive Order 4710</u>	8/29/1927	Added 6 acres to tracts near Mendenhall Bridge and map.	10
<u>Executive Order 4712</u>	8/30/1927	Eliminated areas surrounding native Villages around Angoon, Hoonah, Hydaburg, Kake, Kasaan, Klawak, and Yakutat.	10a
<u>Executive Order 5439</u>	9/5/1930	Defines Petersburg town site by rectilinear survey.	11
<u>Executive Order 7088</u>	6/27/1935	Added 553.7 acres from Mendenhall Elimination. Map.	12
<u>Executive Order 7624</u>	5/29/1937	Added 3800 acres on Douglas Island.	13
<u>Executive Order 7742</u>	11/19/1937	Added 2,311.93 acres known as Sandy Beach. Addition-Petersburg and map.	14
<u>Proclamation 2330</u>	4/18/1939	Eliminated 505,600 acres Cape Fairweather to Excursion Inlet and enlarged Glacier Bay Monument.	15
<u>Proclamation 2416</u>	7/14/1940	Changing names of certain names Wildlife Refuges.	16
<u>Public Land Order 177</u>	9/30/1943	Reserved use for War Department	17
