 SUBJECT Fish Resources of the Snow River alternative site

NOTES There has been some question about whether or not anadromous fish migrate upstream past the Snow River dam site. The ADF&G habitat map shows that fish (sockeye) migrate to lower Paradise Lake. However, Lyman Nichols (ADF&G-Cooper Laker) states that a velocity barrier exists at this site which prevents upstream migration. This call was made to confirm L. Nichols observations. T. McHenry stated that a velocity barrier does exist and no anadromous fish pass upstream of the site. The South Fork of the Snow River does have sockeye and coho adults. The resource is considered to be of low to intermediate levels.
