> Re: Susitna-Watana Hydroelectric Project, FERC Project No. 14241-000; Initial Study Report Part D: Supplemental Information to June 2014 Initial Study Report

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (Commission) directive in its October 27 letter, the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) hereby files its Initial Study Report (ISR) Part D. AEA reiterates that its ISR Part D format is intended to build upon the prior documents for the convenience of stakeholders and Commission staff to allow them to preserve the review they have done to date.

Consistent with AEA's past approach to the ISR, the ISR Part D enables reviewers to focus on those studies which are being updated with information generated since the June 2014 ISR. The alternative of filing an amended ISR as a single document would not allow reviewers to easily distinguish what is new based on the work completed since AEA filed the ISR in June 2014.

The ISR Part D is a "roadmap" document covering each of the approved study plan's 58 studies. This roadmap provides a status report on the study implementation and identifies which sections of the ISR are being updated with post-June 2014 study results. In addition the Part D provides a cross-reference to any pertinent technical memoranda, and outlines the remaining steps to complete the study plan.

The ISR Part D purposefully excludes a schedule for completing the remaining studies. AEA is focusing on the scope of work and sequence of activities for each study that are

² While the majority of data collection was completed in calendar year 2014, in some cases the study reports and ISR Part D incorporate work that continued into 2015.

required to meet the objectives and requirements of the study plan. Consistent with its August 26, 2015 letter, AEA is requesting the Commission to issue a revised Study Plan Determination before addressing the schedule moving forward.
