

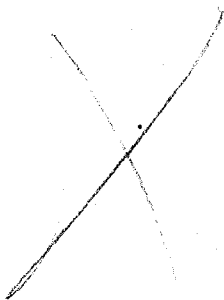

COMMENTS

In 1910, this settlement was established as a supply center for the Innoko-Iditarod placer district (Orth 1967). Although I could not obtain any data on this site as a native settlement prior to that, further investigation through oral accounts and historical research may reveal its prior existence as a native village. Iditarod probably was significant to native history since there was a winter trail between it and Shageluk and there was probably some interaction between the two settlements.
