


— CABIN LOGS ARE HEWN FLAT ON THEIR INSIDE FACES,

(NOT TO SCALE)







Cache remains - built of spruce logs. Cradle notched on support post 8-10" in diameter probably extends 6-8' above the ground. Round hails occur where used as fast tie. Logs encircles tops of support posts 6" below their tops. Tops have "V" cuts to support cross posts. Wall logs average to 6" in dia at butt end, alternated in walls as to direction of butt stops. Logs are mostly are cut almost no beveling. Support posts sawn on base ends, indicating they were shot only appx 90" long. Evidence of lateral posts may indicate cache was not very stable! Door was made of boards 1" x 8 or 9" wide nailed together w/ 2 braces & 1x4's. Roof condt. is unknown. Boarded in wings may indicate lumber was possibly shipwrecked? Fill log of doorway is appx 30-31" cut out for bottom of door.

Doorway faced trail, to the west, fronting almost right upon it.
