1912 - SERVED AS AN EARLY RIVERLAND-SUPPLY POINT FOR MINING INTERESTS IN THE CRIPPLE AREA. ~~THE~~ THIS SITE CONSISTED OF MATILDA PETERSON'S ROADHOUSE, 2 STORES, MAIL STOP AND SERVED TODAY AS A FISH CAMP FOR GUIDE SPORT FISHERMEN.

A.R.C. Report of 1916 identifies a "stable" roadhouse at Cripple sig on the Buls to Takotna trail.
