LOG CABIN: 12'X24' CABIN IS SITUATED VERY NEAR THE PRESENT HWY. IT IS
OUTHOUSE: 4'X4' IN POOR CONDITION AND CURRENTLY BEING OCCUPIED. THE
SHED: 5'X5' STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION HAS NEGOTIATED
WITH THE OWNER, THE FOREST SERVICE AND OTHER INTER-
ESTED PARTIES ABOUT MOVING THE CABIN BACK FROM ITS ORIGINAL POSITION TO
ALLOW FOR HWY IMPROVEMENTS. IT STILL REMAINS IN ITS ORIGINAL POSITION
BUT PRESENTS PROBLEMS TO DOT. IT HAS BEEN A POINT OF CONSIDERABLE PUB-
LIC INTEREST OF LATE AND NOT A LITTLE CONTENSION.

6. SIGNIFICANCE
PROBABLY ERECTED ABOUT 1906 BY JOHN C. GILPATRICK WHO MADE THE FIRST
QUARTZ LOCATIONS IN THE MOOSE PASS DISTRICT. MAY HAVE BEEN ERECTED AS
EARLY AS 1846 WHEN HE DISCOVERED GOLDEN SUMMIT CREEK.
