3. LOCATION	
Ca. 400 feet north of Seward Highway Mile 102, on the east side of Falls Creek.	
4. DESCRIPTION (DIMENSIONS, PRESENT CONDITION, TOPOGRAPHICAL & OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL FEATURES, ETC.)	
This log cabin was probably related to the mail trail (Turnagain Trail) that connected Knik and Seward. Cabin roof is collapsed, but the walls are standing. Cabin measures 5 meters by 5.7 meters, and is ca. 1.5 meters tall. The trail, overgrown with alder and poplar trees, is visible about 12 meters north of the cabin. The site has been severely vandalized.	
5. SIGNIFICANCE	
This cabin is expanding our knowledge about activity prior to the construction of the railroad on the north side of Turnagain Arm.
