A large wood frame building, original section constructed of logs hauled 70 miles from Council by horse. The building has been kept up well and is still in good condition although altered and enlarged over the years. After first decade was a major stopover for dog teams traveling on the Iditarod Trail. It is the only roadhouse still standing that was used in the famous "race to Nome" in 1925 during the diptheria epidemic in Nome. Was also a temporary orphanage.
