

Annual Report to the Founders Board: 2009

ARLIS began the year with a new five-year MOU and a renewed commitment to improving access to its growing number of unique collections and resources. An equipment upgrade during the year replaced end-of-life network infrastructure and enabled staff to provide more and better information services at the reference desk and online. Special

project funds supported additional staff time to accomplish an increased amount of cataloging and technical processing.
