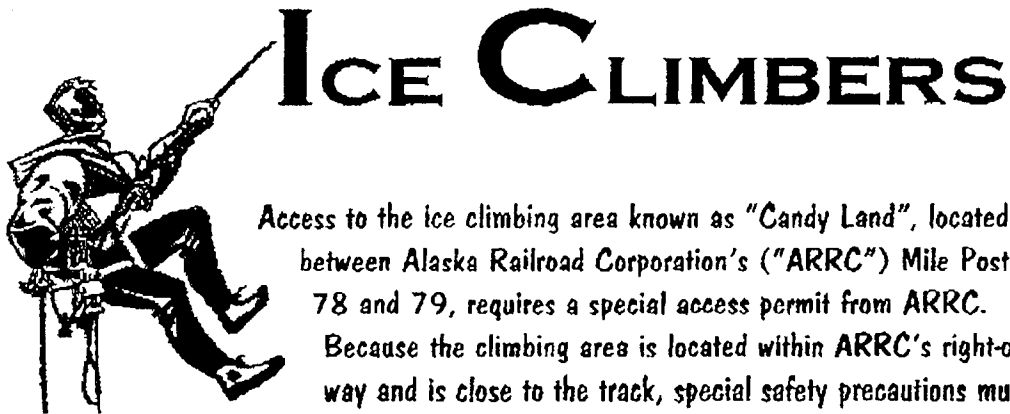

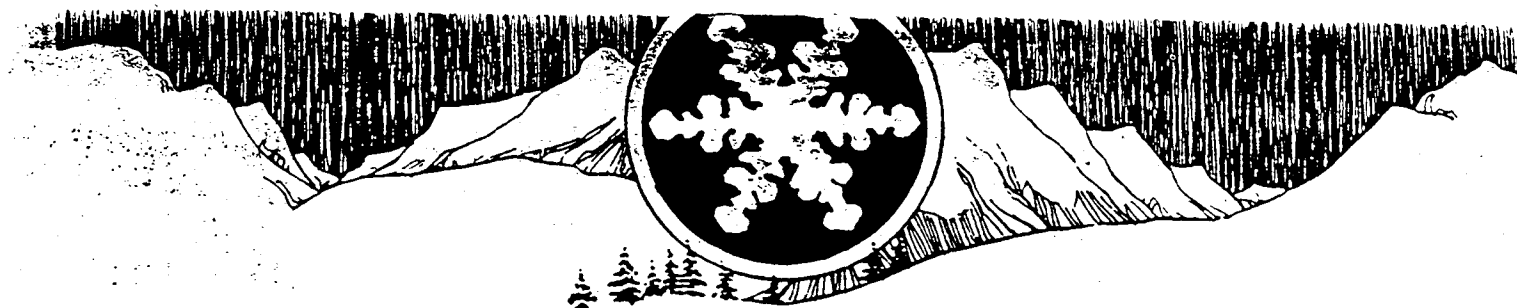
Access to the ice climbing area known as "Candy Land", located between Alaska Railroad Corporation's ("ARRC") Mile Post 78 and 79, requires a special access permit from ARRC. Because the climbing area is located within ARRC's right-of-way and is close to the track, special safety precautions must be followed.

The need for a permit to climb in this area is due to several near misses between climbers and trains. ARRC has determined that if climbers know the proper safety precautions and followed safety guidelines when near the track, climbers can climb in this area, and ARRC can continue to operate its trains safely.

We need the cooperation of ALL ice climbers. Please help us keep this climbing opportunity open. Come get a permit before climbing in this area. You can get an access permit at ARRC's Real Estate Department, 327 Ship Creek Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday (Three-story red brick building behind the depot). There is no charge for the permits. Climbers under 18 years of age must have a parent or guardian present when obtaining a permit.

Do not climb without a permit. Individuals on ARRC's right-of-way (100 feet on either side of the track) without an access permit can be charged with criminal trespass.
